Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read 1 Corinthians 1:26-31. How would you respond to a person who has a kind of "spiritual inferiority complex" that keeps them from stepping up to do anything for Christ and the advancement of his kingdom?
- 2. Read 2 Corinthians 3:4-5 and 4:7-11. How do these truths help you when you sense that making a difference for Christ in this world is beyond your ability?
- 3. Read 2 Timothy 2:15-23. How do these reminders to Timothy address the problem with those who are tempted to take the truths found in the two previous discussion guestions and insist, that regardless of their progress in godliness or their training, that they should be permitted to do any sort of ministry they desire to do?
- 4. Read Luke 8:4-15 and John 12:3-6. What kinds of questions can you ask yourself to help ensure that your alliance with Christ is not for all the wrong reasons?
- Read John 21:15-17. Mindful of the context and this low point in Peter's life (after his denial of Christ), what do you learn about Christ by his repeated call for Peter to get back to feeding his flock?
