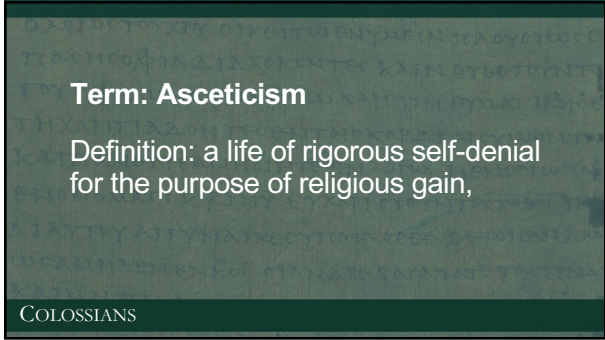
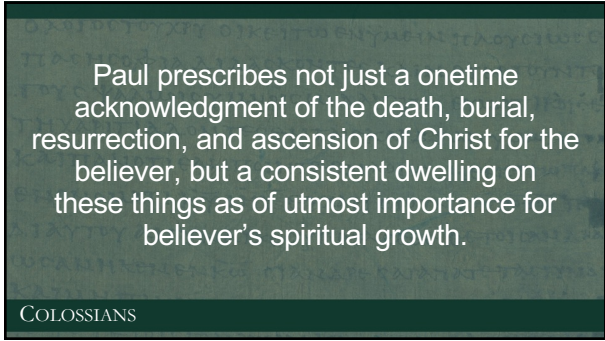

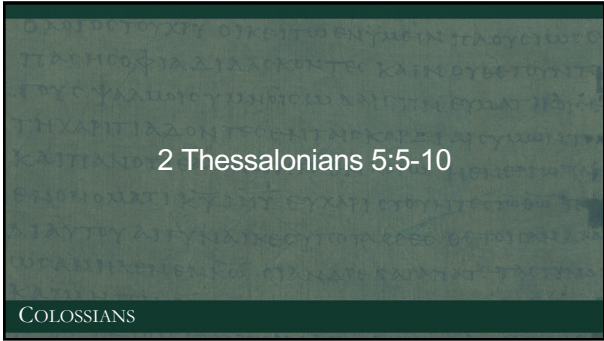

Sermon: Colossians 3:1-4

1. What comfort is there in Christ resurrection and ascension for the believer?

2. Christianity has often placed a tremendous amount of emphasis on celebrating the resurrection of Christ on one particular day, Easter. A. What are some pros and cons to such a tradition?

B. How does the one-day emphasis align with Paul's instructions to the believer in Col. 3:1-4?

3. According to Col. 3:1-4, how many of those whom Christ had raised from death to life would be with Him in glory? _____ How does this passage line up with Paul's letter to the Romans in Romans 8:29-30?

4. Col. 3:1-4 gives eschatological assurance to those who have faith in Christ. Why is there often an emphasis on Christ being "seated" in heaven that should give us great assurance? See Hebrews 8:1-6.

5. In 2 Peter 3:10-14, Peter speaks of the day that Paul speaks of in Col. 3:4. According to Peter, how should knowing this information effect our lives practically?

According to verse 13, what does Peter remind the believers that they are awaiting, looking forward to?

6. The reality and struggle of being a citizen of heaven yet still living on earth is challenging. Are Christians to do nothing and just wait for Heaven? Paul certainly knows that he is on his way to heaven, but does he take it easy while on earth and just idly wait for heaven? See Phil. 1:21-26
