Prayer of a Fainting Soul Psalm 143

What to do when you are amidst severe trial and you are fainting spiritually.

1. Seek God! (We see here David's approach to God) vv. 1-4 **(1) David Prays!** (1) "Hear my prayer, O LORD, give ear to my pleas for mercy!" (2) He takes the Proper Foundation for his Appeal (2) - He appeals to God's faithfulness (Heb: truth) "In your faithfulness answer me, God's righteousness in Your righteousness!" - He knows he cannot appeal based upon "Enter not into judgment with your servant, his own righteousness or performance! For no one living is righteous before you." (3) He Lays His Need fully before the Lord (3-4) - He is conscious of his own sin and need of forgiveness. (v. 2) - The enemy of his soul has pursued him and beaten him down. - He feels entirely isolated from God and His favor. - He is overwhelmed, disheartened. 2. Use of All of the Means of Grace! vv. 5-6 (1) David engages heart and mind in the truth of God. - The activity of faith: "I remember... meditate... ponder" - The focus of faith: God's great saving works of old [N.T. Gospel!!] - "the days of old" - "all that you have done" NKJV: "all your works" - "the work of your hands" (2) He prays! He reaches out to God! "I stretch out my hands to you; my soul longs for You like a parched land."

- He longs for communion with God

3. Plead for Abundant Grace!

vv. 7-12

(1) David pleads for the tokens of God's favor toward him (7-8a)

- That God would answer him speedily! "Answer me quickly, O LORD!

My spirit fails!"

- That God would assure him of His favor

"Hide not your face from me...

Let me hear in the morning of your

steadfast love, for in you I trust."

- This he feels he needs more than any other blessing!

(2) He pleads for the working of God's grace in him. (8b-11)

-1- To be enlightened in the knowledge of God's will

- "Make me know the way in which I should go."
- "Teach me to do your will"
- "Let your good Spirit lead me on level ground"

-2- To be quickened to do God's will

"For your name's sake, O LORD, preserve my life."

NKJV "Revive me, O LORD, for Your name's sake."

(3) He pleads for the working of God's providence on his behalf. (12)

NKJV: "In your mercy cut off my enemies; And destroy all those who afflict my soul."
