a. The rapture is the coming of the Lord for His saints.	
b. The revelation is the coming of the Lord with His saints.	
2. The Place of the Rapture and Revelation	
a. At the rapture, the saints are caught up in the air.	
b. At the revelation, Christ returns to the earth.	
3. The Power of the Rapture and Revelation	
a. The rapture brings a message of hope and comfort.	
b. The revelation brings a message of fear and judgment.	
4. The Premonitions of the Rapture and Revelation	
a. The rapture is an event without any signs, only promises.	
b. The revelation is an event preceded by a multitude of	
signs.

a. The rapture is strictly New Testament mystery.	
b. The revelation is the subject of Old Testament prophecy.	
6. The Promise of the Rapture and Revelation	
a. The rapture is a promise given exclusively to the church.	
b. The revelation primarily concerns the nation of Israel.	
7. The Place of the Rapture and Revelation	
a. At the rapture, the church's expectation is to be taken into	
the Lord's presence.	
b. At the revelation, Israel's expectation is to be ushered into	
the Kingdom. 8. The Program of the Rapture and Revelation	
a. The rapture is before the Tribulation.	
b. The revelation is after the Tribulation.	
9. The Pace of the Rapture and Revelation	
a. The rapture will be in a moment.	
b. The revelation will be visible.	
10. The Proving of the Rapture and Revelation	
a. The rapture is tied to judgment seat of Christ.	
b. The revelation is followed by the judgment of nations and	
ultimately the Great White Throne Judgment.	
11. The Prize of the Rapture and Revelation	
a. In the rapture, Christ comes to receive His bride.	
b. In the revelation, Christ comes to receive His kingdom.
