# 1 Romans 7:1-14 Freed From the Law 2 Introduction • Communicating a clear gospel; Rom. 1:16, 3:21-22, 3:24, 3:28, 4:5, 5:1, 5:8 • What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin...? • We have freedom from the sin nature; Rom. 6:2, 7 Freedom - But how do we live out that freedom? • Rom. 6:15 – What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? Note Rom. 6:14 "...not under law but under grace" Freedom from the law in Romans 7 3 Romans 7:1 (Illustration thru Verse 3) • "Or do you not know brethren (for I speak to those who know the law)" • An emphasis on "know" in Paul's epistles • "That the law has dominion over a man as long as he lives" • Dominion (kyrieui) – to rule over, exercise control as master, Rom. 6:14 4 Romans 7:2 (Illustration) • "For the woman who has a husband is bound by the law to her husband" • Bound (dedetai) – To tie, bind, physically restrained "As long as she lives" • The law has dominion · Bound by the law to her husband · "But if the husband dies" "She is released from the law of her husband" • Released (katergetai) – Freed from 5 Romans 7:3 (Illustration) "So then if, while her husband lives, she marries another man, she will be called an adulteress" • "But if her husband dies, she is free from that law" • "So that she is no adulteress, though she has married another man" 6 Romans 7:4 (Application thru Verse 6) • "Therefore, my brethren" "You also have become dead to the law" "Through the body of Christ" "That you may be married to another" • We are now free to marry another • "To Him who was raised from the dead" • "That we should bear fruit to God"

7 Romans 7:5 (Application)

"For when we were in the flesh"Prior to our salvation

"The sinful passions which were aroused by the law"
Passions (pathemata) – propensity, inclination

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- "Were at work in our members to bear fruit to death"
  - Legalism or law keeping bears fruit to death because it is based on self-effort

## 8 Romans 7:6 (Application)

- "But now"
  - Contrasting good news
- "We have been delivered from the law"
- "Having died to what we were held by"
  - How were we delivered from that severe husband?
- "So that we should serve in the newness of the Spirit"
  - We were not delivered to be idle or independent
- "And not in the oldness of the letter"
  - Oldness = old way

#### 9 **Romans 7:7**

- "What shall we say then? Is the law sin?"
  - More anticipated questions
- Response = "Certainly not"
- · "On the contrary"
- "I would not have known sin"

#### 10 **Romans 7:8**

- "But sin"
  - The problem is not the law, it's our sin nature
- "Taking opportunity by the commandment"
  - Opportunity = aphormen favorable circumstances
- "Produced in me all manner of evil desire"
- "For apart from the law sin was dead"
  - Without the law, Paul was alive with an inactive sin nature

#### 11 **Romans 7:9**

- "I was alive once without the law"
  - Once = formerly, previously (once as in time, not quantity)
- "But when the commandment came"
  - Not referring to the original giving of the law
- "Sin revived and I died"
  - With the law, Paul's sin nature was activated and Paul was without power in his Christian life

#### 12 **Romans 7:10**

- "And the commandment, which was to bring life"
  - The law serves a good purpose, 1 Tim. 1:8-11
- "I found to bring death"
  - Paul was separated from bearing good works
  - · Separated from spiritual living

## 13 **Romans 7:11**

- "For sin, taking occasion by the commandment"
  - Occasion = aphormen favorable circumstances

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- "Deceived me, and by it killed me"
  - Living by the law provides favorable circumstances for a Christian to be deceived

## 14 **Romans 7:12**

- "Therefore, the law is holy"
  - The law does not deceive us
- "And the commandment holy and just and good"

#### 15 **Romans 7:13**

- "Has then what is good become death to me?"
- "Certainly not!"
- "But sin, that it might appear sin"
  - The character of our sin nature becomes clear for what it is
- "Was producing death in me through what is good"
  - Our sin nature is so sinful that it takes what is good (law) and produces sin

## 16 **Romans 7:13**

- "So that sin through the commandment might become exceedingly sinful"
  - Exceedingly (hyperbolen) Our sin nature is sinful to an exaggerated, extreme degree, more than is necessary

## 17 **Romans 7:14**

- "For we know that the law is spiritual"
- "But I am carnal sold under sin"
  - Paul, as a believer, is a slave to his sin nature
- The warning is that we, as believers, when we live by means of the law become slaves to our sin nature
