Slavery in the Roman World

Obey your earthly masters, verse 5

With fear and trembling, verse 5a

Sincerity of heart, verse 5b

Obey as you would obey Christ, verse 5c

Why did Paul glory in his slavery to Christ? (Romans 1:1; Philippians 1:1; Titus 1:1)

Symbols of degradation and defeat have been elevated by the cross.

What did the master-slave relationship imply?

Serve wholeheartedly, verses 6-7

God does notice your good deeds and He will reward, verse 8

A Word to Masters who are also slaves, verse 9

Do the same thing. Have the same mind, because you have the same master.

God is unimpressed with social standing or economic power.

Do not threaten your servants.
