### The Confession and Baptism of the Eunuch

I. His desire II. His confession III. His baptism

# I. The Eunuch's Desire

- A. God brought the eunuch to His Word and His Word to the eunuch (vs. 27)
  - 1. Though he was well-to-do, he was not doing well
  - 2. God does not do a half work: if He makes thirsty, He will satisfy (Ps. 42:1)
  - 3. God preached the Gospel to him through Philip (vs. 32-35)
    - a. Philip preached Jesus as the provision of the Father for lost sinners
    - b. As he preached, Holy Spirit made the eunuch's heart burn for Jesus

### II. The Eunuch's Confession

- A. Philip's preaching 'caught' a man soul' (35)
  - 1. The Gospel of Jesus became irresistible for the eunuch (vs. 36)
  - 2. But it appears he might have felt 'hindrances' to believe it was for him
  - 3. Has our soul been caught like the eunuch's?
- B. Philip's answer invites a man's soul (37a)
  - 1. His answer is purest & simplest Gospel message (vs. 37a; ls. 55:1)
  - 2. This answer is also true for us whoever and wherever you are!
    - a. What we often think hinders us, doesn't hinder us
    - b. What hinders us the most?

- C. The eunuch's confession is where all need to come
  - 1. This elementary confession embraced the whole Gospel of Is. 53
    - a. Jesus is a real, righteous man Who died for others
    - b. Jesus is also Son of God: to give infinite value to His work
  - 2. "I believe..." means I forsake all to trust Him only for my salvation

# III. The Eunuch's Baptism

- A. Philip baptized the eunuch (38) upon his confession of faith (Mark 16:16)
- B. What did his baptism mean?
  - 1. It pictured what God has done to all who by faith in Christ
  - 2. It would have strengthened the eunuch faith in Gospel of Is. 53: (vs. 39b)

#### **CLOSING REMARKS:**

- A. Belonging to a church is not saving though it will bring much good
- B. Only personal faith in Jesus Christ is saving: John 6:53; Acts 13:38-40
  - 1. in salvation is not about who you are
  - 2. in salvation it is to Whom you belong or Whom you trust
