Introduction–Christians Have Integrity in their Words, commitments, vows, promises, and covenants!

- I. Hear the *Radicality* of the Prohibition and Speak the Truth!
 - A. He's talking about *oaths* and *vows*
 - B. The *Pharisaical* Perversion–**Surrogate Oaths** (vv. 34–36)
 - C. The *Human* Perversion (v. 37)
 - D. The *Heart* of the Matter–Three Reasons Why Christians Tell the Truth Simply and Plainly
 - 1. Because we wish to imitate the Father of Lights (Jas 1:17) and not the Father of Lies (John 8:44)
 - 2. Because Reality and Truth are *Friends* not *Foes*
 - 3. Because Christians *uphold* the Law rather than *overthrow* the Law
- II. Avoid the Blackhole of *Biblicism* and Strike *Balance!*
 - A. The Anabaptist Tradition–A Sketch of the Scourge of Biblicism
 - B. Systematic Theology as the Antidote to Biblicism
 - 1. The Reformed Tradition has seen a place for oaths and vows
 - 2. Keep in mind the nature of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount
 - 3. God, Jesus, and Paul all Took Vows/Oaths (Matt 26:63–64; 2 Cor 1:23; Gal 1:20; 1 Thess 5:27)
