"Samuel Rutherford, the seventeenth-century Scottish pastor whose words lie behind that hymn, was no stranger to suffering and persecution. As a young man, he was exiled by the church authorities from his beloved parish of Anwoth in Southern Scotland for writing in defense of the doctrines of grace. As an old man, when the monarchy was reinstated under Charles II, he was charged with high treason for his book in which he argued that even monarchs were subject to the law. When the summons came, however, he responded from his deathbed, 'Tell them I have got a summons already before a superior Judge and judicatory, and I behove to answer [It is necessary for me to answer] my first summons, and ere your day come I will be where few kings and great folks come.' ... The day is indeed hastening on when the sands of time will run out and the beasts will face their judgment, but for the saints, glory will dwell forever in Immanuel's land!"
