"Discipleship to Jesus was not like the discipleship to a Jewish rabbi. The rabbis bound their disciples not to themselves, but to Torah; Jesus bound His disciples to Himself. The rabbis offered something outside themselves; Jesus offered Himself alone. Jesus required His disciples to surrender to His

authority. They thereby became not only His disciples, but also His douloi, His bond-slaves."
