II. A Strange Work. Cf. 1 Cor.1:18,23; 15:3

## VI. The Good News Emanating from Christ's Work.

A. His work accomplished a *redemption. (ransom)* Cf. Matt.20:28; Eph.1:7; 1 Pet.1:18

"Redemption means to set free from slavery by the payment of a ransom price."

## B. His work accomplished a *propitiation*. Cf. Rom.3:23-26; Heb.2:17 (9:5); 1 Jn.2:2; 1 Jn.4:10

*Propitiation means to appease, to placate, to turn away wrath by making satisfaction – to remove anger and displeasure and move from disfavor to favor.* 

Propitiation presupposes the wrath and displeasure of God.

At the cross Christ's death turned away God's wrath and displeasure.

## C. His work accomplished a *reconciliation*. Cf. Rom.5:10; 2 Cor.5:18-20; Eph.2:16; Col.1:21,22

Reconciliation presupposes a disrupted relationship.

The means of reconciliation is the removal of the cause of alienation.

D. His work accomplished the grounds for the *justification of sinners*. Cf. Isa.61:10; Jer.23:6; Rom.5:9; 1 Cor.1:30; 2 Cor.5:21; Phil.3:8,9

*Justification defined*: "That gracious act of God whereby, on the basis solely of Christ's accomplished mediatorial work, he declares the sinner just, and the latter accepts this benefit with a believing heart." (Wm. Hendricksen)
