- Principle of Transformation: "Put off Renewal Put on"

Treating Others with Grace!

"Put Off" the Relational Poisons 4:31

- "Bitterness" "irritable state of mind"
 - Signs of bitterness
 - Seriousness of bitterness
- "Wrath" -- "explosive anger"
- "Anger" -- the "slow burn"
- "Clamor" -- "loud, verbal release of anger"
- "Evil Speaking" -- "lies meant to destroy or damage another"
- "Malice"-- "ill-will towards another"

"Put On" the Relational Purities 4:32

- "Become kind to one another"
 - A process over time, the product of the Spirit of God.
 - Meaning: "kind, benevolent, mild"-- Luke 6:35
 - Kind in words—Ephesians 4:29; 2 Timothy 2:24-26
 - Kind in actions—Romans 12:10, 17
- Cultivate "Tenderheartedness"

 - Etymology: *"good intestines"* Explanation: Open heart, flowing emotions
 - Illustration: Paul's relationship to Corinthians—2 Cor. 6
 - Opposite: Hardheartedness

"Renewal" through Relational Pardon-- 4:32

- Meaning-- three Greek words for 'forgive'
 - "charizomai" -- bestowing grace. A gift!
 - "apoluo"—releasing the guilt and grip
 - "aphiemi" -- removing the offense
- Model—"Forgive as God has forgiven us"
- Method: How do we forgive another?
- Asking for and Granting Forgiveness
 - Forgiveness for those who do not ask?
- Motivation: Why forgive?
 - We've been forgiven much!
 - Failure to forgive hurts YOU!
