Forgiveness: A Hard Thing To Do

Indeed, we all make many mistakes. For if we could control our tongues, we would be perfect and could also control ourselves in every other way. <u>Jas 3:2</u> (NLT)

Offenses are inevitable.

- 1. The Offense of False Teachers is **<u>devastating</u>** (v.1-2)
 - a. Little ones stumble when leaders give an **example** of unbelief.
 - b. Little ones stumble when leaders create **<u>doubts</u>** in their minds.
 - c. Severe punishment awaits the **hypocritical offenders**.
- 2. Offenses even among believers are *inevitable* (v.3-4)
 - a. Christianity is personal but it is not **private**.
 - b. Christianity is to be lived out in **<u>community</u>**.
 - c. The unity of the Christian community (church) is of **highest** importance.
- 3. Forgiving offenses requires great faith (v.5-6)
 - a. **<u>Confront</u>** the offending brother/sister (rebuke him) confrontation is hard to do.
 - b. **Forgive** your offending brother/sister. Forgiveness is hard to do
 - c. Forgive your offending brother **<u>obediently</u>**.
 - i. It is not the volume of our faith but the **presence** of our faith that moves mountains.
 - ii. It is not the volume of faith but the **<u>act</u>** of faith that grants forgiveness.
- Forgiving offenses is our <u>humble duty</u> (v.7-10) He is the master and we are his servants (*doulos* = slaves).
 - *i.* Like a slave requires no special thanks for doing his duty; we deserve no **special credit** for forgiving our fellow servant.
 - We have all the <u>faith</u> we need to obey God's command to forgive.
 - iii. Forgiven people <u>forgive people</u>! Set them free so <u>you can</u> <u>be free.</u>
