THE 'PERFECTING" WORK OF THE MINISTRY Eph. 4:11-16

OUTLINE:

I. THE OVERSIGHT OF THIS "PERFECTING" WORK

Note: v. 11 "And he gave ... some pastors and teachers for the perfecting ..."

Note: "pastors and teachers" not two separate offices

- 1. "pastors" are men gifted by the Holy Spirit to be *shepherds*
- 2. "teachers"— are men gifted by the Holy Spirit to be *school masters*
- A. What isn't involved in the oversight of a pastor/teacher
 - 1. Pastor/teachers are not at liberty to **assume for** themselves the **dominance** over the entire work of the ministry

Note: The idea/concept of "clergy" and "laity" is *foreign* to the *apostolic* church, and was *formulated* and made *religiously* fashionable by the *apostate*, Roman Catholic church. John 9, 10; 1 Pet. 5:2, 3.

- 2. Pastor/teachers are not at liberty to accept to themselves delegation of the entire work of the ministry.
- B. What is involved in the oversight of a pastor/teacher
 - It is the business of the pastor/teacher to see that people are, as perfectly as possible, *equipped* for spiritual work and warfare. "Perfecting" = *katartizo*: to equip for service"
 - a. They have to be taught the precepts and principles
 - b. They have to be taught to *pray*
 - 2. It is the business of the pastor/teacher to see that people are, as perfectly as possible, *engaged* in spiritual work and warfare.
 - a. The pastor/teacher must know how to help people *discover* their spiritual gifts
 - b. The pastor/teacher must know how to help people demonstrate their spiritual gifts

II. THE OBJECT OF THIS "PERFECTING" WORK

Note: v. 12b "[the perfecting of] the saints ... "

- A. The "saints" are those who are to be perfected in terms of being able to identify and implement their gifts within the body of Christ
- 1. This will help them "find their place" in their local church
- This will enable them to *function* as they are meant to function in their local church
- B. The "saints" are those who are to be perfected in terms of being able to recognize and reach their goals as members of the body of Christ
 - 1. Church members need to be "perfected" in terms of being clear as to what the *overall* mission *of* their church is.
 - 2. Church members need to be "perfected" in terms of being clear as to what their *own* specific mission *in* their church is.

III. THE OBJECTIVE OF THIS "PERFECTING" WORK

Note v. 12c "The edifying of the nobody of Christ"

A. Edification that **results** in our **measuring uv** of our own l local body of Christ

Note: v. 12d "unto the stature of the fullness of Christ."

B. Edification that **requires** us to **mature**

Note: vv. 14, 15 "That we ... head, even Christ."
