WCF 10, Of Effectual Calling, 4. Others, not elected, although they may be called by the ministry of the Word, and may have some common operations of the Spirit, yet they never truly come unto Christ, and therefore cannot be saved: much less can men, not professing the Christian religion, be saved in any other way whatsoever, be they never so diligent to frame their lives according to the light of nature, and the laws of that religion they do profess. (John 14:6) And to assert and maintain that they may, is very pernicious, and to be detested. **WLC Q. 34.** How was the covenant of grace administered under the Old Testament? A. The covenant of grace was administered under the Old Testament, by promises, prophecies, sacrifices, circumcision, the passover, and other types and ordinances, which did all fore-signify Christ then to come, and were for that time sufficient to build up the elect in faith in the promised Messiah, by whom they then had full remission of sin, and eternal salvation.

WLC Q. 123. Which is the fifth commandment? A. The fifth commandment is, Honor thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee. **WLC Q. 127.** What is the honor that inferiors owe to their superiors? A. The honor which inferiors owe to their superiors is, 1) all due reverence in heart, 2) word, and 3) behavior; 4) prayer and thanksgiving for them; 5) imitation of their virtues and graces; 6) willing obedience to their lawful commands and counsels; 7) due submission to their corrections; 8) fidelity to, defence and maintenance of their persons and authority, according to their several ranks, and the nature of their places; 9) bearing with their infirmities, and covering them in love, that so they may be an honor to them and to their government. **WLC Q. 128.** What are the sins of inferiors against their superiors? A. The sins of inferiors against their superiors are, 1) all neglect of the duties required toward them; 2) envying at, 3) contempt of, and 4) rebellion against, their persons and places, 5) in their lawful counsels, 6) commands, and corrections; 7) cursing, mocking, and 8) all such refractory and scandalous carriage, as proves a shame and dishonor to them and their government.
