James 5:14-15 (this seems to be directly related to unconfessed sin in a believer's life)

1 John 5:16-17 (this is the ultimate chastisement and only God knows what sin is a sin unto death...it seems to be different for different people)

Our duty as children of God is to daily judge ourselves in light of God's Word, to confess our sin(s) in order to avoid the chastisement of God.
