Confession of Sin

Restore to us the joy of our salvation, and uphold us with Your free Spirit. Amen.

Assurance of Pardon

Our Lord Jesus Christ has bestowed power and commandment to his ministers, to declare and pronounce to those who are truly repentant, His absolution and remission of their sin. Therefore, may Jesus Christ absolve you of your sins, as you also remember His admonishment, to "go and sin no more". In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

Psalter: Psalm 9:11-20, tune: "Immortal, Invisible"

Sing praise to the Lord, Who in Zion does dwell; Among all the peoples His great doings tell. When blood He avenges, His mem'ry is clear; The cry of the poor never fades from His ear.

Catechism Recitation

Confession of Faith, Heidelberg Catechism Lord's Day 37

Q. But may we swear reverently by the name of God?

A. Yes, when the magistrate requires it, or when it may be needful otherwise, to maintain and promote fidelity and truth to the glory of God and our neighbor's good; for such an oath is grounded in God's Word, and therefore was rightly used by the saints in the Old and New Testaments.

Q. May we swear by "the saints" or by any other creatures?

A. No, for a lawful oath is a calling upon God, that He, as the only searcher of hearts, may bear witness to the truth, and punish me if I swear falsely; which honor is due to no creature.

The Lord's Supper

Hear the words of the Holy Gospel, taken from Saint Matthew: "As they were eating, Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is My body". Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins". Now, in Christ's Name, I take these elements, the bread and the wine, to be set apart by prayer and

thanksgiving to the holy use for which He has appointed them. Let us pray:

O God, You have, by the blood of Your dear Son, set apart for us a new and a way into the Holiest of All. Cleanse our minds, we implore You by the inspiration of Your Holy Spirit that, drawing near unto You with a pure heart and undefiled conscience, we may receive these, Your gifts, without sin, and worthily magnify Your holy name through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The bread, which we break is, by faith, a participation in the Body of Christ.

In just like manner, the cup that we bless is, by faith, a participation in the Blood of Christ.

O God, guide us with Your wisdom, chasten us with Your justice, help us with Your strength, fill us with Your fullness, shield us with Your shade, and fill us with Your grace. For the sake of Your anointed Son who died for us, let us depart in peace and love.
