<u>2LCF 1:9</u> "The infallible rule of interpretation of Scripture is the Scripture itself; and therefore, when there is a question about the true and full sense of any Scripture (which is not manifold but one), it must be searched by other places that speak more clear."

II. PAUL'S PURSUIT of HOLINESS (Rom.6:1-8:15)

III. FINAL DEDUCTIONS on the NECESSITY of HOLINESS

- 1. <u>Pursuing holiness is necessary</u> because we have a new nature, birthed by the Spirit of God.
- 2. <u>Pursuing holiness is necessary</u> because we have remaining sin that robs from us the many blessings God desires for us that

accompany conformity to Christ.

- 3. <u>Pursuing holiness is necessary</u> because without it, a person reflects a life that is indifferent to God's authority over them as their Creator, which is the mind of a non-believer.
- 4. <u>Pursuing holiness is necessary</u> because Jesus died to not only save us from the condemnation of sin, but also from the power and dominion of sin. To ever cease in pursuing holiness is to mock his sacrifice upon the cross.
- 5. <u>Pursuing holiness is necessary</u> because simply GOD commands it, to ignore or treat it with indifference is to be in rebellion against Him.
