- 1. What logical additions do you need to make to the following statement to have the complete gospel: "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners"?
- 2. What do we learn about God from the following words in Paul's statement?
 - a. "trustworthy"
 - b. "came"
 - c. "sinners"
- 3. How does Paul's recognition of his sinfulness drive him to greater faithfulness?
- 4. Whom is salvation primarily for? Explain.
- 5. Explain how patience is a key aspect of the gospel and salvation.
- 6. In what way is Paul an example to others?

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Do you have a regular practice of reflecting on your salvation? Explain what you do.
- 2. "The greater the sin, the greater the mercy." How can this statement encourage you to greater faithfulness?
- 3. Reflect on the fact that God primarily saves people for His own glory? How does/should this energize your commitment and service to Him?
- 4. In what ways are you thankful for God's patience with you?
- 5. If you were to write a doxology, what characteristics or activities of God would you include?
- 6. Based on Paul's reflections, what would you say to a Christian who says he is too sinful to serve? What would you say to someone who is not excelling in his service and commitment to the church?
- 7. What further convictions or questions do this passage and sermon raise for you?
