## I. A Discussion of Self-Reliance

- A. Proverbs 28:26
  - 1. The Bible in this verse gives us a clear warning against self-reliance.
  - 2. The word here for trusteth is the word that means to run to for refuge.
  - 3. A refuge is a place of perceived safety.
  - 4. The Bible says if you take refuge in your own heart, you are a fool.
- B. This is contrasted in the book of Proverbs in Proverbs 3:5.
  - 1. Here we are admonished to trust the Lord with all our heart.
  - 2. And lean not unto our own understanding.
- C. Does this mean we do nothing and simply rely on God to do it all?
  - 1. No, Consider the Israelites at the Red Sea.
  - 2. We have responsibilities to do as people and as Christians.
  - 3. We need to fulfill these responsibilities while trusting in God.

  - 2. Prayer is the key to relying on God.

  - 2. God has given you two institutions that you are to rely upon.
    - a. The family
    - b. The church
      - i. We are part of another family that is supposed to rely on one another as well.
      - ii. You have a duty to rely on your church family.
    - iii. It takes humility to rely on others instead of just myself.
