Therefor Be Imitators of God

Ephesians 5:1 Therefore be **imitators** of God, as beloved children.

Imitators (mimētēs): one who imitates someone else

Ephesians 5:1 Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children.

Beloved (agapētos): object of one's affection; only

God's interest in and concern for His children is infinitely greater than the greatest and the noblest natural parent's interest in his or her child. God is lovingly concerned about us. He watches us just as the natural parent watches his little child beginning to walk for the first time, or as the child goes out to school for the first time. He stands at the gate and watches him as he goes round the corner and out of sight; that is an expression of loving interest.

Walk (peripoteo): manner of living; way of life
