17:3: Perseverance of the Saints Through Sin

The reality of sin for true believers

They may fall into grievous sins and continue in them for a time, due to the temptation of Satan and the world, the strength of corruption remaining in them, and the neglect of means of their preservation.

- Falls into grievous sin aren't rare either
 - o E.g. Peter (Matthew 26:70ff, Galatians 2)
- Even extended falls happen
 - o 2 Samuel 11-12
- Causes
 - Temptation of Satan and the World
 - Romans 12:2, Galatians 5:17

How does God intend to preserve us?

- God preserves us through prayer
 - o Ephesians 6:18, Luke 22:46
- God preserves us through His Word
 - o James 1:21
- God preserves us through fellowship
 - o To correct and restore sinners.
 - Matthew 18:15–20, Galatians 6:1
 - o To stir up and keep from falling into judgment
 - Hebrews 10:24–27

The damage of sin for true believers

In so doing, they incur God's displeasure and grieve His Holy Spirit; their graces and comforts become impaired; their hearts are hardened and their consciences wounded; they hurt and scandalize others and bring temporary judgments on themselves.

- Sin incurs God's displeasure and grieve the Holy Spirit
 - o Isaiah 64:9, Ephesians 4:30
- Sin impairs grace and comfort
 - o Psalm 51:10–12
- Sin hardens hearts and wounds consciences
 - Psalm 32:3–4
- Sin hurts and scandalizes others
 - o Hebrews 12:5–6

Nevertheless, they will renew their repentance and be preserved through faith in Christ Jesus to the end.

• Luke 22:32

Application

- 1. Consider what the confession says about the kinds of damage sin causes. Is there any area that you have not paid enough attention to?
- 2. Although falling into sin is common among Christians, that doesn't mean we want to experience such a fall. What is one important way God would want you to be guarding against such a fall? How will you pursue growing in that area?
- 3. We often forget that repentance is a great blessing from God. How can you give thanks for your repentance?
- 4. Take some time to praise God for persevering in faithfulness, even when you sin.
