<sup>4</sup> Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of *any thing* that *is* in heaven above, or that *is* in the earth beneath, or that *is* in the water under the earth: <sup>5</sup> Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the LORD thy God *am* a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth *generation* of them that hate me; <sup>6</sup> And shewing mercy unto thousands of them that love me, and keep my commandments.

<sup>7</sup> Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God in vain; for the LORD will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain.

<sup>8</sup> Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. <sup>9</sup> Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: <sup>10</sup> But the seventh day *is* the sabbath of the LORD thy God: *in it* thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that *is* within thy gates: <sup>11</sup> For *in* six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them *is*, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it.

<sup>12</sup> Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee.

<sup>13</sup> Thou shalt not kill.

<sup>14</sup> Thou shalt not commit adultery.

<sup>15</sup> Thou shalt not steal.

<sup>16</sup> Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour.

<sup>17</sup> Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor any thing that *is* thy neighbour's.

## QUESTION # 117: HOW IS THE SABBATH OR THE LORD'S DAY TO BE SANCTIFIED?

### ANSWER:

THE SABBATH OR LORD'S DAY IS TO BE SANCTIFIED BY AN HOLY RESTING ALL THE DAY,<sup>A</sup> NOT ONLY FROM SUCH WORKS AS ARE AT ALL TIMES SINFUL, BUT EVEN FROM SUCH WORLDLY EMPLOYMENTS AND RECREATIONS AS ARE ON OTHER DAYS LAWFUL;<sup>B</sup> AND MAKING IT OUR DELIGHT TO SPEND THE WHOLE TIME (EXCEPT SO MUCH OF IT AS IS TO BE TAKEN UP IN WORKS OF NECESSITY AND MERCY<sup>C</sup>) IN THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE EXERCISES OF GOD'S WORSHIP;<sup>D</sup> AND, TO THAT END, WE ARE TO PREPARE OUR HEARTS, AND WITH SUCH FORESIGHT, DILIGENCE, AND MODERATION, TO DISPOSE AND SEASONABLY DISPATCH OUR WORLDLY BUSINESS, THAT WE MAY BE THE MORE FREE AND FIT FOR THE DUTIES OF THAT DAY.<sup>E</sup>
