Enjoying the Sabbath Matthew 12:1-13 October 27, 2013

<u>Main Point:</u> The Sabbath is a day of blessing; therefore, enjoy it as Jesus wants you to.

1. Like the Pharisees, we often make the Sabbath about what we cannot do.

2. Jesus came to restore the Sabbath to its original design, so that we would keep it rightly today.

3. The Sabbath is a day of blessing for us; it's not to be a burden.

4. Enjoy the Sabbath as Jesus wants you to.

Matthew 5:17-19¹⁷ "Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. Joseph Pipa "Christ Himself taught six times about the Sabbath, whereas He taught on only one occasion about murder and three times on marriage. If this commandment [to keep the Sabbath] were destined for the dustbin of ceremonial law, why do the Gospel writers devote so much attention to it? Can you think of any ceremonial law regarding which Jesus spent so much time trying to correct people's practice?"

Exodus 20:8-11⁸ "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. ⁹ Six days you shall labor and do all your work, ¹⁰ but the seventh day *is* the Sabbath of the LORD your God. *In it* you shall do no work: you, nor your son, nor your daughter, nor your male servant, nor your female servant, nor your cattle, nor your stranger who *is* within your gates. ¹¹ For *in* six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that *is* in them, and rested the seventh day ... (NKJV)

Joseph Pipa "The Sabbath reminds us that we must cease from our own works, we cannot earn God's favor, we cannot work our way into heaven, nor can we merit righteousness. No, the Sabbath is our solemn confession and testimony that we rest in Jesus Christ alone for our salvation and we glory in Him. On this day we declare that He alone is our delight; He alone is our refuge and our hiding place." **Joseph Pipa** "When God makes a day holy, He separates it from its normal everyday uses to the exclusive purposes of worship."

Leviticus 23:3 ³ `Six days shall work be done, but the seventh day *is* a Sabbath of solemn rest, a holy convocation ... (NKJV)

Isaiah 58:13-14¹³ "If you turn away your foot from the Sabbath, *From* doing your pleasure on My holy day, And call the Sabbath a delight, The holy *day* of the LORD honorable, And shall honor Him, not doing your own ways, Nor finding your own pleasure, Nor speaking *your own* words, ¹⁴ Then you shall delight yourself in the LORD; And I will cause you to ride on the high hills of the earth, And feed you with the heritage of Jacob your father. The mouth of the LORD has spoken." (NKJV)
