KHCB – Q & A – June 24, 2021

The transcript contains the Questions received – parenthesis indicate where in the broadcast the question is asked :

Questions

1 - (03:35) - A listener is living in Japan and is wondering about Babylon and what is going on there now.

2 - (07:15) - Ezekiel's war ends with God displaying His Glory among the Nations. For those who teach that the Church might witness this war, wouldn't this be contrary to the finished work of Christ on the Cross during the Church Age? For this reason and others, I believe Dr. Woods has the correct view on the timing of Ezekiel's war.

3 - (09:50) - I had a question on discernment – the appropriation of discernment in the Church today in accordance with Scripture. Also, please comment on the <u>methods</u> of discernment. Lastly, because so many people can get hurt by discernment, would it be more appropriate to the have the desire to have discernment over other people or would it be more appropriate to have the desire to discern over the intents of our heart – to discern over the weapons of our warfare?

4 - (14:40) - I have relative that is coming to visit me, a lady cousin, and she actually lives with another lady. I am having an issue with how to house them, the two of them, when they come to visit. I'm having a problem with them in that relationship sleeping in the same room or the same bed.

5 - (17:34) - If there are people who sincerely believe that they are a different gender than the one to which they were born, and it's not for the practice of same sex acts, then what is the Christian's responsibility to such individuals?

6 - (20:28) – There's two different beliefs in the Church – one belief is that even after you have received Jesus Christ as your Savior, that you <u>can still</u> lose your salvation. One of the second beliefs in the Church is that once you have received Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior, you <u>cannot</u> lose your Salvation, you can lose your fellowship with Jesus, but not your relationship with God in Jesus Christ. Can you break these two beliefs down?

7 - (24:50) - 1 John 5 mentions a sin not unto death and a sin that is unto death. What's the difference between the two?

8 – (35:00) – Please compare Hebrews 2:6 ("What is mankind that you are mindful of them, a son of man that you care for him?) to 1 Cor 15:47 (⁴⁷ The first man was of the dust of the earth; the second man is of heaven.) Which one of those men in 1 Cor 15:47 is this particular man in Hebrews 2:6? Another question is from Hebrews 7:11-14 ("¹¹ If perfection could have been attained through the Levitical priesthood—and indeed the law given to the people established that priesthood—why was there still need for another priest to come, one in the order of Melchizedek, not in the order of Aaron.

¹² For when the priesthood is changed, the law must be changed also. ¹³ He of whom these things are said belonged to a different tribe, and no one from that tribe has ever served at the altar. ¹⁴ For it is clear that our Lord descended from Judah, and in regard to that tribe Moses said nothing about priests.) What is the Law of the new tribe of Judah has and what is the Law?

9 - (41:20) - I have a similar question to Babylon in three parts. The 1st one is in Revelation 11:8 (⁸ Their bodies will lie in the public square of the great city—which is figuratively called Sodom and Egypt—where also their Lord was crucified.). So, instead of saying "city", use the word "country". Other Scripture refers to Babylon and other sins. The caller believes that the term "Babylon" refers to the United States based on the sins of this nation. The question is does the Bible point to the USA as Babylon?

10 - (48:33) – When a Christian dies, does their spirit go to sleep until the Resurrection?

11 - (50:50) – The caller has a question about homosexuality – is it considered a sin if the person does not have multiple partners and only has one partner?

12 - (57:00) - A caller asks if it is ok to throw away a Bible that is old and unusable.

13 – (58:20) – What is the difference between "types" and an "allegory"?
