	b. Jeanne d'Albret. 1528-1572
	"A seems so right and necessary that, for my part, I consider that it would be disloyal and cowardice to God, to my conscience, and to my people to remain any longer in a state of suspense and indecision." - Jeanne d'Albret

 - a. Anna Reinhard Zwingli. 1484-1538 "The Reformation's Weeping Mother"

"When the complete Bible was published in 1529, Zwingli gave her a copy; it became her favorite book. She tried to make sure that every in the congregation had a copy at home." - Rebecca VanDoodewaard
b. Anna Adlischweiler Bullinger. 1504-1564 "The Zurich Mother"
"Her house was a home to the homeless, as Protestant from all over Europe came to stay. Zurich was an asylum to the persecuted Reformed believers of other countries." - Rebecca VanDoodewaard
c. Katharina Schutz Zell. 1497-1562. "The Mother Reformer"
"God is glad when the craftsman at his bench, the maid at the sink, the farmer at the plow, the dresser at the vines and the mother at the cradle break forth in of prayer, praise and instruction." - Katharina Zell
