- The Dedication of the First-born to God
 - Of flock
 - Of children

The Exodus Begins

The People (12.37-40)

- 600,000 men twenty years and older
- With women and children (i.e.,
 < 20 years) ≈ 2,000,000+
- A minority group ("mixed multitude")
- Very much flocks and <u>herds</u>
- At the end of 430 years

Red Sea




THE PRESENCE

Exodus 14 – 40

Crossing the Red Sea (14.1 – 15.21)

The <u>Event</u> (14.1-31)

- Blocked by the sea, pursued by pharaoh (10-12)
- Three great miracles (19-29)
- Pharaoh was probably not among this group
 The Song of Moses . . . Echo by Miriam (15.1-21)

Travel to Mt. Sinai (15.22 – 19.2)

 At Marah (Marah means "bitterness"): Bitter water (15.24-26)

At <u>Elim</u>
Wilderness
of Sin(16.136)

Manna and Meat (16.2-3)

- Joshua's introduction in the biblical record
- Hur

Travel to Mt. Sinai (15.22 – 19.2)

- Jethro (18.10-12)
 - Worship
 - Zipporah, sons
 - Division of labor
- Arrival at Mt. <u>Sinai</u>
 - On 15th day of the third month (19.1)

Giving of the Law (19.3 – 23.33)

- Preparation of the People (19.3-25)
 - God's goal is to make them a people that will reflect to the world who, what, and how God is
- Kingdom of priests/holy nation
 Moses goes up the mountain (3-11)

Giving of the Law

- 2 days of preparation
 - People declare willingness to obey the laws of God
 - Purification of the people
- 3rd day: given to people orally
- People once again declare intended obedience

Giving of the Law

The Ten Commandments

- You shall have no other gods before me
- 2. You shall not make for yourself an idol
- 3. You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain
- 4. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy

- 5. Honor your father and your mother
- 6. You shall not murder
- 7. You shall not commit adultery
- 8. You shall not steal
- 9. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor
- 10. You shall not covet

Exposition of the Law (21 - 23)

- Given over the next 3 months
- Civil Laws (21.1 23.9)
 - Social relationships
 - Care for widows, poor
 - Family relationships
 - Administration of justice
 - Property rights
 - Criminal punishment

Exposition of the Law

- Ceremonial Law (Religious matters)
 - Priestly functions
 - Sacrifices & offerings
 - Sabbaths and Feasts (23.10-19)

Instructions for the Conquest (23.20-33)

- Iniquity of Amorites completed! (Gen 15.16)
- God commands against worshipping Canaanite gods
 - God will drive out the Canaanites
 - Make no covenant with the Canaanites (see Joshua 9)
 - No Canaanites to live in your land (so you will not serve their gods)

Ratification of the Covenant (24)

- A most important day for Israel
- The most appropriate day to point to when Israel truly became a "nation"
- Moses as mediator: received the "Book of the Covenant" and read it to the people

Giving the Law

- Moses on the mountain 40 days
 - With Joshua
 - Decalogue inscribed by God onto tablets
 - Instructions for the Tabernacle and Priesthood (25 – 31)

False Worship: The Golden Bull (32-34)

- Apostasy (32.1-14)
 - golden <u>bull</u>
 - wrath of God (32.10)
 - Moses pleads with God₁
 - The LORD "changed his mind" (anthropomorphism)

False Worship: The Golden Bull (32-34)

- Discipline by Moses (32.15-28)
 - Tablets of Law broken (as the people had broken the Law)
 - Destroyed bull, put it in water and made the people drink it
 - Moses hated sin

The Golden Bull

- Moses and Levites discipline 3,000 with the sword (32.28)
- The LORD smites the people (32.35; same?)
- Moses' prayer for forgiveness (32.31-32)

The Golden Bull

- Preparation for proceeding (33.1-23)
 - The Lord threatens to withdraw his Presence (1-4)
 - Tent of meeting with The Presence(7)
 - not the tabernacle
 - Moses commendable spirit and prayer focused on The Presence (12-16)

Restoration and Renewal

- Second 40 days on the mountain
- Moses' request to see God's glory (33.18-23)
- Renewal of the tablets of the Law (34)
- Construction of the Tabernacle (35-40)
