Text: Then He said to Thomas, "Reach here with your finger, and see My hands; and reach here your hand and put it into My side; and do not be unbelieving, but believing." (John 20:27)

Question 66: What are sacraments?

Answer: Sacraments are visible, holy signs and seals. They were instituted by God so that by our use of them, He might make us understand more clearly the promise of the gospel and seal that promise. And this is God's gospel promise: He grants us forgiveness of sins and eternal life by grace because of Christ's one sacrifice accomplished on the cross.

Article 33: The Sacraments
