There is more than a little pathos in that note, especially in that appeal: Would that you could have Him for your God! That, I suggest, may well be the message of 6:1-7 (and 4:1-44) to Israel marooned in Babylon. 'Here is a God who is present and mighty in every sort of emergency. Would that you could have him for your God!'"
