The Lord is faithful to address the 'spiritual deformities' in His peop	ple
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1. The Prophet's Spiritual Deformity Exposed	vv. 1-3	
(1) Jonah very angry!	"But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he became angry."	
 The occasion: God's showing mercy to the Ninevites Now a 'surfacing' of Jonah's sin which had previously remained hidden 		
(2) Jonah 'vents' -1- He prays! Even the 'angry prayers' of the saints a	are heard!	
-2- A great 'disconnect'! - He knew what God was like in His mercy and forgiveness		
-3- A particular hardness – "Put me to death as You were going to do at first!"		
2. The Prophet's Spiritual Deformity Addressed	l: God's Lesson vv. 4-11	
(1) The 'Question' (4-5)	"Is it right for you to be angry?"	
- Jonah persists in his sin. He still hopes for judgment! (2) The 'Student' Prepared (6-8)	!	
-1- The LORD prepares <u>a plant</u> : a source of great delight and satisfaction to Jonah		
-2- The LORD prepares <u>a worm</u> : to destroy the plant		
-3- The LORD prepares a dry withering wind: to make	Jonah keenly feel the loss of the plant	

- (3) The Lesson Applied (9-11)
 - -1- The 'Question' put again

"Is it right for you to be angry about the plant?"

-2- The Lesson plainly stated: A great contradiction in Jonah's heart!

Jonah felt pity for the plant which had been destroyed

- He had neither produced it nor maintained it!
- Though lovely, it was a very transitory thing!

Should not the LORD have pity on Nineveh?

- He had produced it and caused it to grow Can He not properly feel pity for those to whom He has given life?
- He had blessed its inhabitants with children Can He not properly pity the most helpless among mankind?
- He had blessed it with an abundance of animals Can He not properly pity even the beasts?

-3- No response recorded

- None is needed!
- The lesson is not merely for Jonah; it is for all the people of God!

Further Application:
