John 7:25-36 OT: Malachi 3:1-5

**Theme:** As the opposition against Jesus intensifies he answers questions that will be asked through the ages: Who is he? Where does he come from? Where is he going? Questions we must still answer today.

**Background:** Jesus faces rising opposition In the middle of the feast of Booths/Tabernacles.

**Introduction:** "Where are you from?" doesn't always have a simple answer. Jesus leaves the Jews wondering just what he means by his answers to simple questions.

## I. Is This The Christ?

- A. Raising A Provocative Question
  - 1. Aren't they seeking to kill him?
    - From a New Constituency Jerusalemites (25)
    - Aware of the plot (26,30)
  - 2. Why don't they stop him?
    - Because his "hour had not yet come"
- B. An Intriguing Answer
  - Maybe they *know* he really is the Christ! (26b)
  - Nah! Can't mean that
- C. Can we expect anything more?
  - Seeing works greater than those of Moses
  - Heard teaching with authority greater than Moses

## II. Where Does He Come From?

- A. Exposing their confusion (27)
  - 1. We do know where you come from
    - Galilee, of course
  - 2. We don't know where Messiah comes from
    - a. We know his birth place
      - Matthew 2:3-5; Micah 5:2
    - b. We don't know his beginning
      - Daniel 9:25; Malachi 3:1
- B. He was *sent* (28,29)

NOTE: The real question is about his "authority". Is he an independent voice or does he come with the authority of a teacher?

- 1. You know where I'm from
  - In regard to his earthly heritage
- 2. You don't know the one who sent me
  - His *authority* is not self-declared, but is that of the Lord of heaven!
  - a. You don't know him
    - 5:37-42; 8:<u>19</u>, 42-44, <u>55</u>
  - b. Nor the one he has sent

NOTE: The people of Jerusalem thought they could reject his word/work because in their minds, he had no "sender", no authority to back him up. (cf. Exodus 3:10)

APPLICATION: Those who go forth in the name of Christ are "sent"! You don't speak, act, share, on your *own* authority. In Christ, we are commissioned as his ambassadors.

## III. Where Is He Going?

- A. To jail? (30)
  - 1. Arrest him! (32)
    - a. Crowd is beginning to believe (31)
    - b. Pharisees "hear" the murmuring of the crowd
      - Rising concerns
      - Plot becomes clear
    - c. "Chief Priests" have the position of power
      - Combining forces
  - 2. Not yet
    - His time had not yet come.
    - Knows where he is headed and when and how
- B. To his Father (33)
  - 1. Opposition is rising
    - Not going to be with them much longer
    - Turns to topic of his death
  - 2. Back to him who sent me (33)
    - He is going to heaven, to be with the Father
- C. Where they cannot come (34)
  - 1. Seek and you won't find!
    - a. Can certainly relate to the resurrection
    - b. May well be more troubling
      - Amos 8:11,12
  - 2. You can't come where I am
    - Not where "I am going", but where "I am"
    - He is already with the one who sent him

NOTE: By faith, we are <u>now</u> both with him and in him. We await a fuller reality of that union, but it is a present reality.

- D. The ends of the earth? (35)
  - 1. Saying more than they know
    - To the Jews of the Diaspora?
    - To teach the Greeks?
    - A preposterous idea! Couldn't imagine such a thing.

NOTE: The very method Paul used to take the gospel the world

- 2. Missing the point
- 3. Troubled by the truth (36)
  - Jesus again, speaks in a type of "parable"
  - They do not know the one who sent him, hence, they do not understand

## IV. The Questions We Must Answer – Back where we started

- A. Will anyone do more than he has done?
- B. Was He Just a Man or was he *sent from God*?
- C. Is this the Christ?
- D. What more are you looking for?
