"Faith Shipwrecked" 1 Timothy 1: 18-20 September 28, 2014

The Gospel Charge Is The Purity Of Heart That Is The Fruit Of Correct Doctrine, Faith & Love, (vs. 3 - 4)

Message Emphasis: Many are in danger of "running aground" when it comes to their Christian relationship. Simply put, many do not see the necessity of holding to biblical doctrine as the cornerstone of their faith. Rather, many have made faith an additive that is supposed to make life better without really affecting the core essence of what it means to be a follower of Christ. We MUST understand that as a Christian, we are called to contend for the faith and fight for the primacy of faith in everyday life.

"Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel by the power of God, who saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace, which he gave us in Christ Jesus before the ages began," (2 Timothy 1:8-9, ESV)

The Gospel Charge Warns That Abandoning Pure Faith & Doctrine Leads To Destruction, (vs. 18 – 20)

- Faith is a battle that MUST be waged continuously
 - Commissions are passed from one generation to the next We must prepare the next generation This charge I entrust (Pres.Mid.Ind) to you, "and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men who will be able to teach others also." (2 Timothy 2:2, ESV)
 - Commissions are passed to those who have been trained

Timothy, my child, "For I have no one like him, who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare. For they all seek their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ. But you know Timothy's proven worth, how as a son with a father he has served with me in the gospel." (Philippians 2:20–22, ESV)

• Commissions are passed to those who have been set apart for the task

"This is why I left in accordance with the prophecies previously MADE (*Pres.Act.Part*) about you, you in Crete, so that you might put what remained into order, and appoint elders in every town as I directed you – (Titus 1:5, ESV)

• Commissions are not for prominence but for warfare

that by them you may wage (*Pres.Mid.Subj*) the good warfare, "Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness." (James 3:1, ESV)

• *Commissions require the faithful stewardship of sound doctrine*

We MUST ask if someone is able to be a pastor? holding (*Pres.Act.Part*) faith and a good conscience. "He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it. For there are many who are insubordinate, empty talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision party. They must be silenced, since they are upsetting whole families by teaching for shameful gain what they ought not to

- Faith is a battle that MUST be waged decisively By rejecting (Aor.Mid.Part) this, some have made shipwreck of their faith, among whom are Hymenaeus and Alexander,
- Faith is a battle that MUST be waged aggressively whom I have handed (Aor.Act.Ind) over to Satan that they may learn (Aor.Pas.Subj) not to blaspheme (Pres.Act.Inf).

***What Must I Do To Fulfill The Charge? ***

Message Directive: Look to Christ for the salvation of your soul; ONLY in Christ will you be able to fight the good fight of faith.

Training in doctrine is not optional

There is a need for ordained leaders

We MUST ask why someone desires to be a pastor?
