Scripture Reading: 1 Peter 4:1-11 Sermon Catechism Recitation

Confession of Faith, Heidelberg Catechism Lord's Day 38

Q. What is God's will for us in the fourth commandment?

A. First, that the gospel ministry and education for it be maintained, and that, especially on the festive day of rest, I regularly attend the assembly of God's people to learn what God's Word teaches, to participate in the sacraments, to pray to God publicly, and to bring Christian offerings for the poor.

Second, that every day of my life I rest from my evil ways, let the Lord work in me through the Spirit, and so begin in this life the eternal Sabbath.

The Lord's Supper

Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins". Now, in Christ's Name, I take these elements, the bread and the wine, to be set apart by prayer and thanksgiving to the holy use for which He has appointed them. Let us pray:

O God, You have, by the blood of Your dear Son, set apart for us a new and a way into the Holiest of All. Cleanse our minds, we implore You by the inspiration of Your Holy Spirit that, drawing near unto You with a pure heart and undefiled conscience, we may receive these, Your gifts, without sin, and worthily magnify Your holy name through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Hear us, O heavenly Father, for His sake to whom, with You and the Holy Spirit, glory is given forever and ever. *Amen*.
