WLC Q. 178. What is prayer? A. Prayer is an offering up of our desires unto God, in the name of Christ, by the help of his Spirit; with confession of our sins, and thankful acknowledgment of his mercies. WCF 8, Of Providence, 8. To all those for whom Christ hath purchased redemption, he doth certainly and effectually apply and communicate the same; making intercession for them, and revealing unto them, in and by the word, the mysteries of salvation; effectively persuading them by his Spirit to believe and obey, and governing their hearts by his word and Spirit; overcoming all their enemies by his almighty power and wisdom, in such manner, and ways, as are most consonant to his wonderful and unsearchable dispensation. WLC Q. 145. What are the sins forbidden in the ninth commandment? A. The sins forbidden in the ninth commandment are... raising false rumours, receiving and countenancing evil reports, and stopping our ears against just defence; evil suspicion; envying or grieving at the deserved credit of any, endeavouring or desiring to impair it, rejoicing in their disgrace and infamy; scornful contempt [Psalm 35:15-16, 21]; fond admiration; breach of lawful promises; neglecting such things as are of good report; and practicing or not avoiding ourselves, or not hindering what we can in others, such things as procure an ill name.

WLC Q. 123. Which is the fifth commandment? A. The fifth commandment is, Honor thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee. WLC Q. 128. What are the sins of inferiors against their superiors? A. The sins of inferiors against their superiors are, 1) all neglect of the duties required toward them; 2) envying at, 3) contempt of, and 4) rebellion against, their persons and places, 5) in their lawful counsels, 6) commands, and corrections; 7) cursing, mocking, and 8) all such refractory and scandalous carriage, as proves a shame and dishonor to them and their government. WLC Q. 129. What is required of superiors towards their inferiors? A. It is required of superiors, according to that power they receive from God, and that relation wherein they stand, to 1) love, 2) pray for, and 3) bless their inferiors; 4) to instruct, 5) counsel and 6) admonish them; 7) countenancing, 8) commending, and 9) rewarding such as do well; and 10) discountenancing, 11) reproving, and 12) chastising such as do ill; 13) protecting, and 14) providing for them all things necessary for soul and 15) body: and, 16) by grave, 17) wise, 18) holy, and 19) exemplary carriage, 20) to procure glory to God, 21) honor to themselves, and so 22) to preserve that authority which God hath put upon them.
