Julius Caesar makes Antipater the procurator ("manager of Caesar's affairs") in: Judea Samaria


Galilee

Antipater was the father of Phasail and Herod. Phasail was appointed governor of Jerusalem. Herod was appointed governor of Galilee.

Herod became a family name.

Nazareth 150-200 people, some say 500.

Sepphoris 4 miles, hours walk away

Jesus' kinsman were descendants of David who may have settled here after returning from the Babylonian exile. The name Nazareth may have been an intentional name of the promised Messiah the Little-Netzer meaning "offshoot" of David from Isaiah 11:1-2

Carpenter is "*tekton*" meaning someone who works with hard materials: wood, metal, stone. James and Joseph named after two patriarchs. Judah and Simon named after two of the Maccabee brothers.

Greek word for cousins is anepsioi and is not used here, but instead "brothers"
