Acts 28:13b-15

...we came to **Puteoli**. ¹⁴ There we found *brothers* and were invited to stay with them for seven days. And so we came to (*set out for*) Rome. ¹⁵ And *the brothers there*, when they heard about us, came as far as *the Forum of Appius* (40miles) and *Three Taverns* (30miles) to meet us. On seeing them, *Paul thanked God and took courage*.

Romans 1:11-12

¹¹ For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to strengthen you—¹² that is, that *we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith*, both yours and mine.

And when we came into Rome, Paul was allowed to stay by himself, with the soldier that guarded him.

He lived there **two whole years** at his own expense, and *welcomed all who came to him...*

Acts 28:17

After three days he called together the local leaders of the Jews...

III. Gospel Centered Thinking & Living

A. We *Need* Heart Encouragement

Ephesians 6:21b-22 (Colossians 4:7-8)

Tychicus the beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord will tell you everything. ²² I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know how we are, and that he may **encourage your hearts**.

Hebrews 10:19-27

¹⁹ Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but **encouraging one another**, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

²⁶ For if we go on sinning deliberately after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, ²⁷ but a fearful expectation of judgment, and a fury of fire that will consume the adversaries.

B. Jesus is Our Source and Our Model

Philippians 2:1-(11)

So **if there is any encouragement in Christ**, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, ² complete my joy by being of the *same mind*, having the *same love*, being *in full accord and of one mind*. ³ Do nothing from rivalry or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. ...

C. Fellowship is Part of How We See Jesus

Colossians 2:1-5

For I want you to know how great a struggle I have for you and for those at Laodicea and for all who have not seen me face to face, ² that their hearts may be encouraged, being knit together in love, to reach all the riches of full assurance of understanding and the knowledge of God's mystery, which is Christ, ³ in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.

D. Fellowship is Part of Our Witness

Romans 15:5-7

⁵ May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, ⁶ that together you may with <u>one voice</u> glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁷ Therefore welcome one another as <u>Christ has welcomed you</u>, for the glory of God.
