"If your right eye makes you stumble, tear it out and throw it from you; for it is better for you to lose one of the parts of your body, than for your whole body to be thrown into hell. "If your right hand makes you stumble, cut it off and throw it from you; for it is better for you to lose one of the parts of your body, than for your whole body to go into hell."

Romans 6:6, 11-12, 8:13 "knowing this, that our old self was crucified with Him, in order that our body of sin might be done away with, so that we would no longer be slaves to sin ... Even so consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus. Abhorring sin (not just hating its consequences) – Ps 97:10, Ps 101:2-4, Pr 8:13, Rom 7:15, 7:20-25

Psalm 97:10 "Hate evil, you who love the LORD ... He delivers them from the hand of the wicked."

Psalm 101:2-4 "I will give heed to the blameless way. When will You come to me? I will walk within my house in the integrity of my heart. I will set no worthless thing before my eyes; I hate the work of those who fall away; It shall not fasten its grip on me. A perverse heart shall depart from me; I will know no evil."

Prov 8:13 The fear of the LORD is to hate evil; Pride and arrogance and the evil way And the perverted mouth, I hate." **Romans 7:15, 20-25** "For what I am doing, I do not understand; for I am not practicing what I would like to do, but I am doing the very thing I hate ... But if I am doing the very thing I do not want, I am no longer the one doing it, but sin which dwells in me. I find then the principle that evil is present in me, the one who wants to do good. For I joyfully concur with the law of God in the inner man, but I see a different law in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin which is in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will set me free from the body of this death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

Parallel: 1 Timothy 6:11 "But flee from these things, you man of God, and pursue righteousness ... faith, love ..."

"pursue righteousness" – study and apply Eph 4:22-24, Prov 15:9, 1 John 1:9

Ephesians 4:22-24 "in reference to your former manner of life, you lay aside the old self, which is being corrupted in accordance with the lusts of deceit, and that you be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new self, which in the likeness of God has been created in righteousness and holiness of the truth."

Proverbs 15:9 "The way of the wicked is an abomination to the LORD, But He loves one who pursues righteousness." **1 John 1:9** "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

1 Timothy 4:12 "Let no one look down on your youthfulness, but rather in speech, conduct, love, <u>faith and purity, show yourself an example</u> of those who believe."

Mark 9:24 "Immediately the boy's father cried out and said, "I do believe; help my unbelief.""

Hebrews 12:1-2 "Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

"pursue...love" – study and apply 1 Cor 14:1a, 13:5, 1 Pet 1:22, 1 Tim 5:2, Prov 5:15-23

- 1 Corinthians 14:1, 13:5, 11 "Pursue love...love...does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own..."
- **1 Peter 1:22** "Since you have in obedience to the truth purified your souls for a sincere love of the brethren, fervently love one another from the heart"
- 1 Timothy 5:2 "... [treat and view] the younger women as sisters, in all purity."

Proverbs 5:15-23 "Drink water from your own cistern And fresh water from your own well. Should your springs be dispersed abroad, Streams of water in the streets? "pursue...peace" – study and apply Heb 12:14, Rom 14:19, 1 Pet 3:10-11, Phil 4:7-9, 4:11-13

Romans 14:19 "So then we pursue the things which make for peace and the building up of one another."

1 Peter 3:10-11 "For, "The one who desires life, to love and see good days, Must keep his tongue from evil and his lips from speaking deceit. "He must turn away from evil and do good; He must seek peace and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and if anything worthy of praise, dwell on these things. The things you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you ... Not that I speak from want, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am. I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need. I can do all things through Him who strengthens me."

4. The _______ - v. 22c "... with those who call on the Lord from a pure heart." "with those..." – study and apply Prov 18:1, Titus 2:3-7, 1 Pet 5:5-11, Heb 13:7, 17, 1 Cor 16:15-16

Proverbs 18:1 "He who separates [ESV 'isolates'] himself seeks his own desire, He quarrels against all sound wisdom." **Titus 2:3-7** "Older women likewise are to be reverent in their behavior, not malicious gossips nor enslaved to much wine, teaching what is good, so that they may encourage the young women to love their husbands, to love their children, to be sensible, pure, workers at home, kind, being subject to their own husbands, so that the word of God will not be dishonored. Likewise urge the young men to be sensible; in all things show yourself to be an example ... **1 Peter 5:5-11** "You younger men, likewise, be subject to your elders; and all of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, for GOD IS OPPOSED TO THE PROUD, BUT GIVES GRACE TO THE HUMBLE. Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you at the proper time, casting all your anxiety on Him, because He cares for you. Be of sober spirit, be on the alert. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. But resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same experiences of suffering are being accomplished by your brethren who are in the world."

Hebrews 13:7, 17 "Remember those who led you, who spoke the word of God to you; and considering the result of their conduct, imitate their faith ... Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they keep watch over your souls as those who will give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with grief, for this would be unprofitable for you."

1 Corinthians 16:15–16 "Now I urge you, brethren (you know the household of Stephanas, that they were the first fruits of Achaia, and that they have devoted themselves for ministry to the saints) [KJV 'they have addicted themselves to the ministry'], that you also be in subjection to such men and to everyone who helps in the work and labors."

Principles of effective accountability (Heath Lambert, *Finally Free*, chapter 3):

- 1. it doesn't rely exclusively on accountability
- 2. it is involved early rather than late.

'You will not experience dramatic change in your struggle as long as you use accountability to describe your sins instead of declaring your need for help in the midst of temptation.'

- 3. it involves someone with maturity (Gal. 6:1-2)
- 4. it involves someone with authority
- 5. it should avoid explicit details
- 6. it places the responsibility for confession on the person with the problem
- 7. it must actually hold people accountable

"who call on the Lord" (prayer, worship) – study and apply Ps 66:18, Ps 51, Rom 12:1-2

Psalm 66:18 "If I regard wickedness in my heart, The Lord will not hear;"

Psalm 51 "For the choir director. A Psalm of David, when Nathan the prophet came to him, after he had gone in to Bathsheba. Be gracious to me, O God, according to Your lovingkindness; According to the greatness of Your compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity And cleanse me from my sin. For I know my transgressions, And my sin is ever before me. Against You, You only, I have sinned And done what is evil in Your sight, So that You are justified when You speak And blameless when You judge. Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, And in sin my mother conceived me. Behold, You desire truth in the innermost being, And in the hidden part You will make me know wisdom. Purify me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; Wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. Make me to hear joy and gladness, Let the bones which You have broken rejoice. Hide Your face from my sins And blot out all my iniquities. Create in me a clean heart, O God, And renew a steadfast spirit within me. Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, the God of my salvation; Then my tongue will joyfully sing of Your righteousness. O Lord, open my lips, That my mouth may declare Your praise. For You do not delight in sacrifice, otherwise I would give it; You are not pleased with burnt offering. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; A broken and a contrite heart, O God, You will not despise."

Romans 12:1-2 "Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind ..."

"from a pure heart" – study and apply Ps 51:10, Matt 5:8, 1 John 3:2-3, 2 Cor 3:18

Psalm 51:10 "Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me."

Matthew 5:8 "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God."

1 John 3:2-3 "Beloved, now we are children of God, and it has not appeared as yet what we will be. We know that when He appears, we will be like Him, because we will see Him just as He is. And everyone who has this hope fixed on Him purifies himself, just as He is pure."

2 Corinthians 3:18 "But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit."

Tim Challies, p. 80-81: 'allow all the resources of God's grace to motivate you toward moral purity. Key among these are the Bible, prayer, and a reliance on God's grace and power for the exercise of self-control. Keep in the forefront of your mind that Jesus Christ had all your sexual sin load upon him at the cross. He faced the just punishment for that sin and he faced the full fury of God's wrath for it; he faced the death your sin demands. By rising from the dead, he showed that he had triumphed over death. He now offers life and he offers freedom - freedom from sin, freedom from even the desire...'

ANTHEM: Strategies for Fighting Lust, by John Piper

I have in mind men and women. For men it's obvious. The need for warfare against the bombardment of visual temptation to fixate on sexual images is urgent. For women it is less obvious, but just as great if we broaden the scope of temptation to food or figure or relational fantasies. When I say "lust" I mean the realm of thought, imagination, and desire ... here is one set of strategies in the war ... in the form of an acronym, A N T H E M.

A – AVOID as much as is possible and reasonable the sights and situations that arouse unfitting desire. I say "possible and reasonable" because some exposure to temptation is inevitable. And I say "unfitting desire" because not all desires for sex, food, and family are bad. We know when they are unfitting and unhelpful and on their way to becoming enslaving. We know our weaknesses and what triggers them…*Flee youthful passions*…

N – Say NO to every lustful thought within five seconds [Titus 2:11-12 'the grace of God...teaches us to say "No" to...worldly passions' NIV]...say it with the authority of Jesus Christ. "In the name of Jesus, NO!" You don't have much more than five seconds. Give it more unopposed time than that, and it will lodge itself with such force as to be almost immovable. Say it out loud if you dare. Be tough and warlike. As John Owen said, "Be killing sin or it will be killing you." Strike fast and strike hard. "Resist the devil, and he will flee from you"

T – TURN the mind forcefully toward Christ as a superior satisfaction. Saying "no" will not suffice. You must move from defense to offense. Fight fire with fire. Attack the promises of sin with the promises of Christ. The Bible calls lusts "deceitful desires" (Ephesians 4:22). They lie. They promise more than they can deliver. The Bible calls them "passions of your former ignorance" (1 Peter 1:14). Only fools yield. "All at once he follows her, as an ox goes to the slaughter" (Proverbs 7:22). Deceit is defeated by truth. Ignorance is defeated by knowledge. It must be glorious truth and beautiful knowledge. This is why I wrote Seeing and Savoring Jesus Christ. We must stock our minds with the superior promises and pleasures of Jesus [see also Hebrews 11:25-26, John 15:11, Psalm 16:11 -> Acts 2:28]. Then we must turn to them immediately after saying, "NO!"

H – HOLD the promise and the pleasure of Christ firmly in your mind until it pushes the other images out. "Fix your eyes on Jesus" (Hebrews 12:2). Here is where many fail. They give in too soon. They say, "I tried to push it out, and it didn't work." I ask, "How long did you try?" How hard did you exert your mind? The mind is a muscle. You can flex it with vehemence. Take the kingdom violently (Matthew 11:12). Be brutal. Hold the promise of Christ before your eyes. Hold it. Hold it! Don't let it go! Keep holding it! How long? As long as it takes. Fight! For Christ's sake, fight till you win! If an electric garage door were about to crush your child you would hold it up with all your might and holler for help, and hold it and hold it and hold it.

E – ENJOY a superior satisfaction. Cultivate the capacities for pleasure in Christ. One reason lust reigns in so many is that Christ has so little appeal. We default to deceit because we have little delight in Christ. Don't say, "That's just not me." What steps have you taken to waken affection for Jesus? Have you fought for joy? Don't be fatalistic. You were created to treasure Christ with all your heart — more than you treasure sex or sugar. If you have little taste for Jesus, competing pleasures will triumph. Plead with God for the satisfaction you don't have: "Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, that we may rejoice and be glad all our days" (Psalm 90:14). Then look, look, look at the most magnificent Person in the universe until you see him the way he is.

M – MOVE into a useful activity away from idleness and other vulnerable behaviors [Eph 4:28]. Lust grows fast in the garden of leisure. Find a good work to do, and do it with all your might. "Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord" (Romans 12:11). "Be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord" (1 Corinthians 15:58). Abound in work. Get up and do something. Sweep a room. Hammer a nail. Write a letter. Fix a faucet. And do it for Jesus's sake. You were made to manage and create. Christ died to make you "zealous for good works" (Titus 2:14). Displace deceitful lusts with a passion for good deeds.
