"The Grand Reception" Philemon 15-17

Introduction:

3.

IE: Weddings Are Special! Think Back To The Last Wedding You Were Invited To! Perhaps Even To One Here!

 Weddings Are Special - Because The Couple To Be Married Is Special To You! And Since They Invited You, You Must Be Special To Them!

- But - Unfortunately - That's Not Always The Feeling Between Those Who Attend!

- A Wedding Can Also Be One Of The Most Awkward And Tension-Filled Events Because
 - It Often Brings Together A Lot Of People & Even A Lot Of Family:
 - Who May Not Be All That Great Of Friends!

- But - In The End:

- All Are Welcome!

- And All Try To Be On Their Best Behavior!

- Because Weddings Are Special!

- And So - At The Reception, Everyone Is All Smiles - In Honor Of The Bride &

The Groom!

2. Unfortunately - Many Events In The Church:

- Look Like The Wedding Reception:

- I've Just Described! Where - On Sunday:

- Everyone Who Comes Tries To:

- Dress Their Best, Look Their Best, And Be Their Best!

- Because Church Is Supposed To Be Special!

- And All Are Welcome!

- But - Underneath The Surface:

- Their May Be Trying Circumstances:

- Hurt Feelings & Even Bitterness!

- And Though We May Be A Christian *Family*:

- We May Not Be All That Great Of Friends!

As We've Seen - For The Last Couple Of Weeks:

- In The Relationship Between Three Christian Men:

- Paul & Philemon & Onesimus:

- This Is Not How It's Meant To Be!

- So - If You're Not There Already, Please Head Back To The Brief Letter Of Philemon With Me!

- Because - In Paul's Appeal *To* Philemon *For* Onesimus:

- That Fugitive & Likely Criminal Runaway Slave:

- We Can See The Kind Of Reception:

- That There Should Be Within The Church!
- So This Morning Let's Begin:
 - By Looking At Just 3 Verses:

- 1:15-17 - "For perhaps he therefore departed for a season, that thou shouldest receive him for ever; / Not now as a servant, but above a servant, a brother beloved, specially to me, but how much more unto thee, both in the flesh, and in the Lord? / If thou count me therefore a partner, receive him as myself!"

- At The End Of 1:17 - Paul Makes His Appeal:

- To Philemon - "Receive Him" - He Says!

- "Receive Onesimus!"

4. Up Until Those Words:

- I'm Sure That The Brief Reunion That Took Place:

- Between Philemon & Onesimus:
 - In Their Master & Slave Relationship:

- Was Filled With An Awkward Tension!

- But Paul Finally Breaks The Ice:
 - And Asks Philemon:
 - "Receive Him!" Remember Paul Is Asking, Not Commanding! So That 1:14 "Thy benefit should not be as it were of necessity, but willingly!"

- But - What Was The Basis For Paul's Appeal? How Could He Possibly Expect Philemon To Respond The Way He Wanted Him To? After All Onesimus Had Done To & Taken From Philemon?

5.	The	Basis	Of	His Rec	eption:

- Was The Gospel!
 - Which Paul Reminded Them About:

- Back In Colossians 3:11-13 - Where Paul Describes The Church As A Place - "Where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcision nor uncircumcision, Barbarian, Scythian, bond nor free: but Christ is all, and in all!" – So – "If any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye!"

- Paul Wanted There To Be:

- Reconciliation Between Philemon & Onesimus!

- "As Christ Forgave You - Paul Wrote - So Also Do Ye!"

- But Paul Also Wanted There To Be:

- A Grand Reception Between Philemon & Onesimus!

- In A Sense - Paul Is Also Saying - "As Christ Received You, So Also Do Ye!"

6. *This* Is The Kind Of Reception:

- There Is To Be Within The Church Of Jesus Christ!

- The Church Is Meant To Be A Taste Of Heaven Here On Earth!

- And - It *Can* Be & *Will* Be:

- When You *Receive* One Another:

- As Christ Himself Received You!

- But - What Does This Kind Of Reception:

- Look Like?

- From The Verses We Just Read - We Will Look At Three Key Features Of What A Christian Reception Ought To Be Like!

* First - There Is:

1.

A New And Abiding Relationship!

- Abiding! Which Is What Paul Points Out:

- In 1:15 - "For perhaps he [Onesimus] therefore departed for a season, that thou [Philemon] shouldest receive him for ever!"

- When Paul Sent Onesimus Back To Philemon:

- It Was For Both Their Sakes!

- So That They Could See:

- The Lord's Direction:

- In Their New Relationship As:

- Brothers In Christ!

- When Paul Uses The Word "Perhaps" He Wants Us To *Think* About The Way God Works!
 - As William Cowper Once Wrote "God Moves In Mysterious Ways, His Wonders To Perform!"

- You See - Even Though Onesimus:

- Ran Away From His Master - And Became A Fugitive Slave - Which Was A Criminal & Even A Capital Offense!

- Paul Doesn't See It That Way!

- He Describes It As Onesimus Being "Departed For A Season!"

- Now - This Is An Interesting Turn Of Phrase!

- Because "Depart" Is A Passive Word!

- IE: Kind Of Like When You Fly - As We Did On Vacation - We Say - "We Flew" - When In Fact - "We Were Flown!" - In Reality, We Had Very Little Control Over Our Departure Or Destination!

- And This Is What Paul Is Doing Here! Paul Is Leading Us To See That *God's* Hand Was In Their Separation!

- It Was The Lord Who Directed Onesimus:

- Away From Philemon - "For A Season!"

- It Was All Part Of God's Providential Plan!

- Reminds Us Of The OT Story Of Joseph - Genesis 45:5 - "Now therefore be not grieved, nor angry with yourselves, that ye sold me hither: for God did send me before you to preserve life!"

- This Is How We Need To See:

- Our New Relationships In Christ!

- God Brought Us Together As Brothers & Sisters In Christ!

- In Different Ways & At Different Times & From Different Pasts & Paths!

- And We Need To Receive Each Other!

- Also See:

- The Lord's Duration:

- For Our Relationships:

- As Christians!

- The Master-Slave Relationship:

- Between Philemon & Onesimus Was Worldly & Thus Temporary!

- But - The Spiritual Relationship:

- Between Them - Would Be Timeless!

- 1:15 - "That Thou Shouldest Receive Him Forever!"

- **IE:** As Our Children Were Growing Up:

- There Came A Point When They Were Not Going To Have Any Other Siblings!

- And So I Would Sometimes Have To Remind Them:
 - That They Are The Only Brother Or Sister They've Got! So Better Get Used To It!

- When You Become A Child Of God:

- You Become Part Of An Eternal Family!

- And Those Around You Today:

- Will Be With You Forever!

- Along With A "Great Cloud Of [Other] Witnesses!"

- And This Is Why Paul Assumes That Philemon's Reception Will Be According To:

- The Lord's Desire:

- In Their Relationship!

- 1:15 - "That Thou Shouldest Receive Him!"

- Knowing The Blessing That You Can *Give* As Well As The Blessing That You Can *Receive!*

- You See - As A Slave - Onesimus Didn't Have A Lot To Offer His Master:

- In Terms Of Restitution!

- But You Don't Have To Have Much:

- In Order To Bless Much!

- And This Is The Kind Of Relationship God Wants Between His

Children!

- Because - This Kind Of Reception:

- Reflects The Reception Of Christ!

- It Is Abiding!

- In Fact - If You Are Here Today As An Unbeliever:

- When You Come To Christ:

- This Is The Kind Of Reception You Can Expect From Christ!

- One That Will Abide:

- Because Of His Direction & His Desire:

- In Your Life!

- Perhaps You Are Here Today:

- After Such A Long Time Of Separation From The One Who Created You!

- So That - You Would Hear Of God's Love:

- And Respond To God's Love:

- By Receiving The One He Sent To Redeem You From Your Sin!

- And - When You Turn To Jesus & Trust In Jesus:

- Who Lived For You & Died For You & Arose For You!

- You Can Experience His Grand Reception As Well!

- He Will "Receive /You/ Forever!"

- And Now - You Can Extend This Grand Reception To Others!

- "As Christ Forgave You, So Also Do Ye!" & "As Christ Received You, So Also Do Ye!"

* Another Feature Of Christian Reception - Is That There Is:

2. A New And Altered Relationship!

- Altered! Which Is What Paul Describes:

- In 1:16 - "Not now as a servant, but above a servant, a brother beloved, specially to me, but how much more unto thee, both in the flesh, and in the Lord?" - Paul Wanted Philemon's Reception Of Onesimus: - To Be Based On: - An Altogether Different Relationship! - 1:16a - "Not Now As A Servant, But Above A Servant!" - As Someone Once Put It: (Lightfoot) - "Though He [Onesimus] Might Remain A Slave, he Could No Longer Be As A Slave" -To Philemon! - Their Relationship, As Brothers In Christ, Was Forever Altered & Altogether Different! - Because - Not Only: - Was There A Change In The Condition: - Of Onesimus - There Was Also: - A Change In Character! - Which Paul Pointed Out For Us Last Week! - In 1:11 - "Which in time past was to thee unprofitable, but now profitable to thee and to me!" - And Now - Philemon Could Receive Him! - But - It Was Also Based On: - An Altogether Delightful Relationship! - 1:16 - "A Brother Beloved!" - Back In Colossians 4:9 - Paul Also Describes Onesimus As A "Faithful & Beloved Brother!" - It Is Clear - That There Was A Tender & Loving Relationship Between Paul & That Slave! - We Hear This Sentiment All Throughout This Letter! - And Even Here - In This Verse: - Paul Says - That Onesimus Was Beloved & Dear: - "Specially To Me!" - His Love For Onesimus Was As High As The Sky! - Yet - Paul Believes That Philemon Could Experience: - An Even Greater Love For His Once Runaway Slave! - Because - He Adds - 1:16 - "How Much More Unto Thee, Both In The Flesh And In The Lord!" - Paul Believed Philemon's Love For Onesimus: - Could Go As Higher Than His! Even Higher Than The Sky! Higher Than The Stars Themselves! - What An Amazing Transformation! - Onesimus Left A Sinner: - But Came Back A Saint! He Was Saved! - Onesimus Left Unprofitable: - But Came Back Profitable! - Onesimus Left A Slave: - But Came Back A "Brother Beloved!" - This Is One Of The Great Features: - Of Christianity - It Changes & Alters: - The Very Fabric Of Human Relationships! - And - Doesn't This Kind Of Reception: - Reflect The Reception Of Christ? - When You Believe In Him & Become A Child Of God: - You Become "Doubly Dear" To The Lord! - "Beloved" - Both In The Flesh & In The Lord! - Because He Created You: - And - Because He Redeemed You! - What The Lord Said To His People In Isaiah 43:1, He Says Now To You - "But now thus saith the LORD that created thee, O Jacob, and he that formed thee, O Israel, Fear not: for I have redeemed thee, I have called thee by thy name; thou art mine!" - And Now - This Is The Kind Of Reception: - We Need To Extend To Each Other As A Church! - "As Christ Forgave You, So Also Do Ye!" & "As Christ Received You, So Also Do Ye!"

* A Third Feature Of Our Reception As Christians Is:

3. A New & Accepting Relationship!

- Accepting! Which Is What We Find:

- In 1:17 - "If thou count me therefore a partner, receive him as myself!"

- Paul Is Not Asking Philemon To "Receive" & Accept Onesimus Back:

- In Any Form Of Compromise!

- But As Partners In Christ!

- He Asks Philemon To Receive:

- Onesmimus As He Would Receive:

- Him! Paul!

- Not Just Because:

- They Are Fellow-Workers!

- Not Just Because:

- They Have Fellowship As Christians!

- But More - Because:

- They Are Friends!

- So "Receive Him [Onesimus] As Myself [Paul]!"
 - Now Imagine If Paul Had Unexpectedly Shown Up At The Doorstep Of Philemon's House:

- There In Colosse!

- How Do You Think He Would Have Received Him?

- Likely:

- With Love!

- With An Embrace:

- As Friends Who Had Not Seen Each Other:

- For A Very Long Time!

- With Interest!

- Wanting To Hear About Paul's Travels:

- And Experiences!

- Not Putting Him To Work:

- But Hearing About His Work!

- With Concern!

- For Paul's Welfare!

- Perhaps He Was Weary From His Journey!

- He Would Need Refreshment:

- From Philemon's Table!

- And - He Would Need Rest:

- In Philemon's Home!

- With Hospitality!

- Making Sure Paul Did Not Feel - In Any Way:

- That He Was An Imposition:

- Or Putting Him Out!

- With Praise & With Prayer!

- Because It Would Have Been:

- A Joyful & A Happy Occasion!

- And *This* Is How Paul Asks Philemon:

- To "Receive" Back His Slave - Onesimus!

- In The Exact Same Way!

- Back Into His Heart! And Even:

- Back Into His Home!

- Though A Slave Was Part Of A Roman Household:

- Rarely Was A Slave An Honored Guest:

- In A Roman Home!

- And This Would Imply:

- A Forgiveness & Pardon:

- From All The Past Offenses!

- And Treatment Not As A Slave Or As A Prodigal But As A "Brother
- Beloved!"

- Providing Him A Favored Place:

- In His Own Home!

- And Lavish Him With All The Tenderness & Thoughtfulness & Grace He Could!

- Because - This Kind Of Reception:

- Reflects The Reception Of Christ!

- It Is Accepting!

- Isn't This What Jesus Describes For Us:

- In John 14:1-3 - "Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me. / In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. / And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and *receive you* unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also!"

- So - "As Christ Forgave You, So Also Do Ye!" & "As Christ Receives You, So Also Do Ye!"

- We Need To Accept One Another:

- As Christian Family & More!

- As Christian Friends!

- Now - Someone Might Say:

- *I* Don't Experience This Kind Of Reception:

- By The Church!

- And - Sadly - This May Be True!

- In Fact Many Today Will Not Darken The Door Of A Church Even Some Professing Believers:
 - Because Of The Kind Of Reception They Received In The Past!
- But This Is Not The Kind Of Reception:

- Jesus Offers You! And Now:

- Just Because You May Not Experience This Kind Of Reception In The Church:

- Perhaps - The Change You Are Looking For - God May Begin With You!

Conclusion:

- 1. Because One Day *All* Of God's People:
 - Will Be Invited To Another Wedding Reception!
 - Even The Final Wedding Reception!
 - And The Wedding To End All Weddings!
 - It Is The "Marriage Supper Of The Lamb" Which We Are Told About In Revelation 19:9!

- But - If You Are In Christ:

- You Will Not Be There As *A Guest!*

- You Will Be There As His Bride!

2. And - *All* Of God's People:

- Will Be There - Not As Extended Family:

- Just Trying To Get Through It With A Pasty Smile On Your Face!

- But - As Friends!

- And In Fellowship & Joy Forever!

3. And - This Is Why:

- Today As A Christian:
 - "As Christ Forgave You, So Also Do Ye!" & "As Christ Receives You, So Also Do Ye!"

- This Is The Kind Of Reception:

- We Need To Have Toward Each Other - As Brothers & Sisters In Christ!

- Because - We Have In Christ:

- A New Kind Of Relationship!

- One That Is Abiding, Altered, & Accepting!

- "As Christ Receives You, So Also Do Ye!"

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
