Entangling Believers Deuteronomy 12:29-32

Being careful not to:

I. Copy –"even so will I do likewise"

(vs. 29-30)

Careful imitating their:

- A. Culture "thou succeed them, and dwell in their land"
- B. Corruption "Take heed to thyself that thou be not snared"
- C. Curiosity "How did these nations serve their gods"
- II. Condone "Thou shall not do so unto the Lord thy God" (v. 31)

 Careful not to approve that which is:
 - A. Hated "every abomination to the Lord which He hates"
 - **B.** Harmful "their sons, and their daughters they have burnt"
 - C. Heathen "to their gods"

III. Corrupt — "observe to do it"

(v. 32)

Careful not to confuse what God calls:

- A. Liberty -"what thing soever I command you"
- **B.** Legalism "thou shall not add thereto"
- C. License "nor diminish from it"

Sentence Sermon

Even the blessings from God can become a snare to us if we focus on the blessings rather than the Blesser.
