God Cares About You Deuteronomy 12:17-28

God cares about your:

- **I.** Watchfulness –"God shall enlarge thy border" (vs. 17-20) *Watchful concerning the:*
- A. Dedicated "Thou may not eat within the gates the tithe"
- **B.** Dependents "Take heed...that thou forsake not the Levite"
- C. Delicious "thou may eat flesh, whatsoever thy soul lusts after"
- II. Worship "God has chosen to put His name there" (vs. 21-25) Worship that is:
 - A. Reasonable "If the place ... is too far from thee then ..."
 - **B.** Respectful "thou may not eat the life with the flesh"
 - C. Right "thou shall do that which is right"
- III. Wellness "that it may go well with thee" (vs. 26-28)

 Wellness that is:
- A. Restrictive "Only the holy things ... the Lord shall choose"
- B. Redemptive -"the blood of thy sacrifices shall be pour out"
- C. Rich "which is good and right in the sight of the Lord thy God"
