This Sunday at CMPC...

We remain in chapter 14 of Revelation this Sunday in our series *Revelation: Strength for Today, Hope for Tomorrow* and will be looking again at verses 12 and 13 with Pastor John's message, *Refrain: To the Place I Belong*. Then on Sunday evening Pastor Ben will be looking at Luke 10.17-24 in our series *Luke: Becoming Certain About the Story*.

By way of reminder, on Wednesday we have the *LifeSouth* blood drive. Give in honor of Kennedy's 98th birthday! The need is great, and when God blesses us with the opportunity and health to give, we should.

This Sunday's hymns all deal with our text and theme To the Place I Belong. We will gather to worship with an old gospel hymn (and yes, it's in the Trinity Hymnal!) that we've sung only 4 times in the last 20 years: When the Roll is Called Up Yonder. In 1893, then 37 year old Sunday School teacher and youth leader James Black was calling the roll for the Sunday evening youth meeting, and a 14 year old girl was not present. The thought bothered Black... and he began to think about a roll being called up in heaven. Now, that's not necessarily a biblical thought; nonetheless, going home, he thought about it and First Thessalonians 4.16. He looked for a hymn about it, and came up empty. So he wrote his own... and he wrote out the tune one time that day... and not a note of it has ever been changed! This hymn has now been translated into at least 14 languages and been recorded by at least 500 different artists. It was also in the 1941 film Sergeant York; and Winston Churchill even referred to it on at least one occasion.

Our hymn of praise will be a new 21st century hymn that the choir has sung: *Christ Our Hope in Life and Death*. Our hymn of testimony will be *On Jordan's Stormy Banks I Stand*. British Pastor Samuel Stennett wrote this hymn in the 18th century; the refrain was added later in this country. The original British tune was written in a minor mode; here in this country, it was given an Appalachian melody. We use a 1997 modified version of that Appalachian melody.

We will then respond to God's word with *Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah*, an 18th century Welsh hymn written to a Welsh tune by the great Welsh hymnwriter William Williams. It was used at both the funeral of Princess Diana of Wales and at the wedding of her son, Prince William. We will use it to encourage us on our pilgrim pathway through God's world.
