And Abram gave him a tenth of everything. ²¹And the king of Sodom said to Abram, "Give me the persons, but take the goods for yourself." ²²But Abram said to the king of Sodom, "I have lifted my hand to the Lord, God Most High, Possessor of heaven and earth, ²³that I would not take a thread or a sandal strap or anything that is yours, lest you should say, 'I have made Abram rich.' ²⁴I will take nothing but what the young men have eaten, and the share of the men who went with me. - The Holy Spirit as author
- The human authors
- Why Genesis has such few details about Melchizedek

The Returning Hero, 16-17

- Abraham and his friends defeat the Mesopotamian Empire, rescue Lot and other citizens from Sodom, other cities of the plain
- King Bera comes to meet him in the Shaveh Valley
- Abraham: entitled to everything he rescued
- Abraham: receives praise
- Remember, he served as a blessing to the nations here

Abraham's Walking by Faith Test, 18-24

- Tested by adversity/Tested by prosperity, cf. Proverbs 27.21
- A surprise visit
- Melchizedek, King of Salem (aka Jerusalem, cf. Psalm 76.2)
 - o Brings food
 - o Pronounces blessing on Abraham
 - o Reminds Abraham of why he succeeded on this journey.
 - § God is the source of blessing
- Abraham's response: gives a tithe to Melchizedek
 - o Abraham needed a tangible way to demonstrate with his life what he believed in his heart- that God had graciously provided for him and God had given him the victory.
 - o The tithe... and the sacrifice in giving
- King Bera of Sodom
 - o Watches... Hopeful?
 - o Note: no expression of gratitude
 - o Bera's Offer
 - § Opportunity for Abraham to grow richer
- Abraham's response- I'm taking nothing
 - o Does not want any confusion about his blessings: it's God alone
 - o How do we handle God's blessings

A Side Note: God's gift of salvation is pictured for us

- An undeserving Lot
- Lot's sin
- Abraham, his kinsman, intervened for him at his own cost
- Abraham rescues someone who does not deserve it

So What About Us?

- Are we tested by adversity... or prosperity
- Our Clash of Kings
- What in our lives tangibly demonstrates our faith
- What about our giving?
- God's gift of salvation.
