

Class #2 - The Gospel's Gracious Demands

"...I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and teaching you in public and from house to house, testifying both to Jews and to Greeks of repentance toward God and of faith in our Lord Jesus Christ." Acts 20:20-21

1. Biblical Texts

- a. **Isaiah 45:21b-22:** *And there is no other god besides me, a righteous God and a Savior; there is none besides me. "Turn to me and be saved, all the ends of the earth! For I am God, and there is no other.*
- b. **1 Thessalonians 1:9-10:** *For they themselves report concerning us the kind of reception we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come.*

II. The Elements of Conversion

A. Repentance

1. Definition (WSC 87)
 - *Repentance unto life is a saving grace, whereby a sinner, out of a true sense of his sin and apprehension of the mercy of God in Christ, does with grief and hatred of his sin, turn from it unto God, with full purpose of, and endeavor after, new obedience*

 - a. **Head** (Intellectual, Rom 12:2)
 - b. **Heart** (Emotional, 2 Cor 7:10-11)
 - c. **Hands** (Volitional, Matt 3:8)

2. Definition (WSC 86)
 - *Faith in Jesus Christ is a saving grace, whereby we receive and rest upon him alone for salvation, as he is offered to us in the gospel.*

1. Putting sin to death (Mortification)

Don't confuse these new patterns with the restoration.
