I. Wisdom's First Steps - The Fear of the Lord - Pt 3

- A. Involves a Subject
- B. Involves an Object
- C. The Content of the Fear of the Lord
 - 4. As In The Old, So In The New
 - a. Practically, the fear of the Lord is a humble conviction of our sin, taking to heart the word of God, and submitting ourselves to Him as Lord and Savior.
 - i. the Word of God is the focus of the fear of the Lord
 - ii. Recognizing, realizing, and resting are the elements of the fear of the Lord
 - Seeing and hearing the Word of the Lord
 - Seeing the relevance and truth of its revelation of Him and His will
 - Resting our weight upon the Word of God in such a way that a changed life is the result
 - b. From a NT perspective, the above would be equated with believing on the Lord Jesus Christ
 - i. Fear or Faith equally describe what a lost rebellious sinner need to repent and embrace
 - Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God. Ro 10:17
 - The fear of the Lord came through hearing the Word of the Lord
 - ii. The Everlasting Gospel Rev 14:6-7
 - "Fear God and give glory to Him, for the hour of His judgment has come
 - worship Him who made heaven and earth, the sea and springs of water."
- D. The Opposites of the Fear of the Lord
 - 1. Evil
 - a. Pr 3:7 Do not be wise in your own eyes; Fear the LORD and depart from evil.
 - i. Hebrew grammar stresses not being wise in your own eyes it is not talking about making a mistake
 - ii. The arrogant person does not hesitate at evil if it serves his own ends
 - b. Pr 8:13 The fear of the LORD is to hate evil; Pride and arrogance and the evil way And the perverse mouth I hate.
 - i. Lady Wisdom speaking the essence of the fear of the Lord
 - ii. The truly godly person is concerned with immorality, crime, bad doctrine, heresy, hypocrisy teaching
 - iii. It is not harsh, judgmental, unloving to hate evil.
 - iv. Indifference and moral numbness is not an option
 - v. Real wisdom is demonstrated in how we communicate a passion for God's glory and truth Jo 2:17; 8:12
 - 2. Conceit
 - a. Value promote desire Pr 1:7
 - i. Line A The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge,
 - ii. Line B But fools despise wisdom and instruction.

- we do not pray to the departed saints or Mary b/c we don't value their possible input, those who do not see value in God's word - Isa 8:19-20 - we do pray to Christ as God, our Great High Priest and Mediator b/c we value what God says about the subject - Col 2:9; 1 Tim 2:5; Heb 4:14-16

b. Point Made - Pr 3:7

- i. Line A Do not be wise in your own eyes; A warning about be a self-impressed person
- ii. Line B Fear the LORD and depart from evil. Gives the antidote

3. Envy of man - Pr 23:17-18

- a. Line A Do not let your heart envy sinners,
 - i. tempting to look at outward prosperity, success, or the fun had by others and think, why do I have to be godly?
 - ii. Psa 73 speaks of getting ones eyes in the wrong place
- b. Line B But be zealous for the fear of the LORD all the day these struggles show the constant need to have God in His rightful place in one's heart
- c. Line C For surely there is a hereafter, And your hope will not be cut off. An eternal perspective is needed Lk 12:16-20

E. The Wrong Side of the Equation - The Fool

- 1. Who He Is
 - a. 'eviyl dense, silly, fool(-ish) (man). May come from a word meaning to grow thick, thick-headed,
 - b. not dealing w/ intellect, he is morally and spiritually insensitive
 - i. mocks at sin Pro 14:9
 - ii. Not quick to learn 27:22
 - iii. Maybe worse than the simple or stupid, but better than the fool and scoffer

2. What he Does

- a. *buwz* disrespect, belittle, despise, to hold as insignificant a physical/emotional response like when you have to eat something you don't like
- b. Used Pr 6:30; 11:12; 23:9
- 3. Why He Does It
 - a. He does not know what is good for him Pro 1:7; 10:21
 - b. He has a mouth problem Pr 10:8,14; 12:16; 17:28
 - c. He is stubborn Pr 12:15; 15:5; 27:22
- 4. His End
 - a. Debt, running up his bill Pro 13:13
 - i. Mistakenly thinks God's lack of action is consent Ps 50 21; Ro 2:4
 - ii. Wisdom laughs at the disaster that comes on the one that does not receive her
 - Pr 1:20-33
 - b. Jesus' evaluation Mt 7:24-27; Jo 12:48
