#### A FEW WORDS ABOUT OUR WORSHIP

#### Standing and raising hands

Because we are whole people with bodies as well as souls, we use our bodies in worship, as the Bible commands. We raise our hands to look to God for help and bless God (Ps. 28:2, 63:3), and we stand to hear the Word out of reverence for God (Neh. 8:5).

#### The Lord's Supper

The Sacrament of communion is a rite of fellowship between Christ and His people. We invite all who have been initiated into the family of God by baptism, and admitted to table fellowship by the leadership of this or some other church, to join in the communion service by faith. If you are unbaptized, or not a church member, please speak with the pastor or elders before the service if you would like to come to join in the Holy Supper.

#### Children

You will notice many children in our service today. Jesus welcomed little children to Himself, and so we welcome them in our worship service! We believe that children naturally love those whom their parents love, and so the best way to help children grow in their love for the Lord Jesus is to have families worship together.

We understand that this means baby noises and wiggly children, and we're fine with that. If your child is fussy or needs a little time to quiet down, we have a mother's nursery in the back room. If your children have never been in worship before, don't worry at all. We realize this is unusual for many people, and we would be happy to offer you help, tips and encouragement.

For the flesh evermore rebels against the spirit, whereby we continually transgress your holy precepts and commandments, and so purchase to ourselves, through Your just judgment, death and damnation.

Notwithstanding, O heavenly Father, forasmuch as we are displeased with ourselves for the sins that we have committed against you, and do sincerely repent us of the same, we most humbly implore you, for Jesus Christ's sake: to show your mercy upon us, to forgive us all our sins, and to increase thy Holy Spirit in us, so that we, acknowledging from the bottom of our hearts our own unrighteousness, may from henceforth not only mortify our sinful lusts and affections, but also bring forth fruit that is agreeable to your most blessed will; not for the worthiness thereof, but for the merits of Your dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ, our only Savior, whom You have already given as an oblation and offering for our sins.

For His sake we are certainly persuaded that You will deny us nothing that we shall ask in His name, and which is according to Your will. For Your Spirit does assure our consciences that You are our merciful Father, and so You love us, Your children, through Him, and that nothing is able to remove Your heavenly grace and favor from us.

To You, therefore, O Father, with the Son and the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, world without end.

## \*CONFESSION OF FAITH

Calvin's Catechism (1545)
