- ¹ And when they drew near unto Jerusalem, and came unto Bethphage, unto the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples,
- ² saying to them, "Go into the village which is opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey bound *there*, and a foal with her. Loose *them* and ¹ bring *them* to Me.
- ³ "And if someone should say something to you, you will say, 'Their Lord has need,'² and immediately he will send them."
- ⁴ Now, this has happened in order that *it* might be fulfilled which was said through the prophet, saying,
- ⁵ "Say to the daughter of Zion," ³ "Look! Your King is coming to you, gentle, and having mounted upon a donkey, even upon a foal, the offspring of a yoked *animal*." ⁴
- ⁶ And when the disciples had gone and done just as Jesus (Matthew 21:1-11

prescribed for them,

- ⁷ They brought the donkey and the foal, and they put upon them *their* clothes, and He sat upon them.
- ⁸ And most of the⁵ crowd spread out their own clothes in the way, but others were cutting off branches from the trees, and were spreading them in the way.
- ⁹ And the crowds who were preceding Him, and those who were following, kept crying out, saying, "'Hosanna' to the Son of David! 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!' 'Hosanna' in the highest *places*!"
- ¹⁰ And when He entered into Jerusalem, all the city was shaken, saying, "Who is this *Man*?"
- And the crowds kept saying, "This is the prophet, Jesus, the one from Nazareth of Galilee!"
