Mark 1:12-13 — "Jesus' Temptation: Wielding the Word & Triumphing Victoriously!"

Temptation in Scripture:

- God does not tempt anyone to sin (James 1.13);
- Jesus tells us a helpful way to pray: "Lord, lead us not into temptation (Mt 6.13);
- We must watch & pray so as to now enter temptation b/c the spirit is willing but the flesh is weak (Mark 14.38).
- Many make an initial profession/decision for Jesus but in times of temptation fall away (Luke 8.13);
- God guards his people so that we are not tempted beyond what we are able (1 Cor 10.13);
- God rescues the godly from temptation (2 Peter 2.9).
- We are tempted when we are "carried away & enticed" by our own lust (heart-desires) (James 1.14).
- In Psalm 91 we learn about the security of the person who trusts in the LORD.
 - You can HIDE in God (1-2)
 - You can HOLD to God (3-13)
 - You can HEAR from God (14-16)

Spurgeon said of Ps 91: "in the whole collection there is not a more cheering psalm"!

Ps 91 is called by another scholar "the

preeminent psalm of refuge"!

Background to Mark 1.12-13

- Mark's gospel is the **rapid**, **fast-pace** account of Jesus' life as the **Suffering Servant:** He's the Son of God, the only Savior for sinners even the Romans!
- In this introduction to his gospel (Mark 1:1-13), Mark shows:
 - The **IDENTITY** of the Son (Son of God; 1.1)
 - The GLORY of the Son (at Baptism; Son of God/well-pleasing)
 - The **VICTORY** of the Son (at Temptation)

THESIS — We want to observe our Champion — Jesus — in the desert in his TEMPTATION. We'll see the account in 3 ways.

I. Consider the **LEADING OF THE SPIRIT** (12a)

II. Consider the <u>TEMPTATION OF SATAN!</u> (12-13a)

Mark 1:12-13 — "Jesus' Temptation: Wielding the Word & Triumphing Victoriously!"

- 1. First—Turn stones into bread (lust of flesh) > temptation to NOT trust God
 - a) serve yourself: do what you want
- 2. Second—Throw yourself down (lust of eyes) >temptation to tempt/force God to act
 - a) be spectacular: be what you want.
- 3. Third—**Bow & worship me (pride of life)** > temptation to worship Satan >> temptation to CROWN w/ o the CROSS
 - a) honor yourself: prize and worship what you want.

Christian, Child of God: You MUST Stand Strong; keep your armor on & bright. Take up the weapons.

- 1. Read the Word
- 2. Memorize the Word
- 3. Meditate the Word
- 4. Counsel the Word
- 5. Apply the Word

III.Consider the MINISTRY OF ANGELS! (13b)

What do we see about Jesus??

- 1. **SINLESSNESS** of Jesus Jesus was OBEDIENT and never sinned.
- 2. **VICTORY** of Jesus Jesus WAGED WAR with Satan himself & triumphed.
- 3. **SPIRIT-GUIDANCE** of Jesus Jesus was led by the Spirit to the toughest test & the Spirit protected & delivered Him.
- 4. **BIBLE-CONFIDENCE** of Jesus Jesus wielded the sword of the Word every time he was tempted.
- 5. **SYMPATHY** of Jesus Jesus lovingly sympathizes with you in every. single. temptation.

At the immediate moment of temptation, F.L.E.E. from lust to God!

Now **flee** from youthful lusts, and **pursue** righteousness, faith, love and peace, with those who call on the Lord from a pure heart.— **2 Timothy 2:22**

Godly men need game plans. God commands His servants to not imitate what is evil but what is good. True men of God need helpful reminders put in place before the moment of temptation strikes. Here is a very brief and memorable game plan for you to FLEE from lust to God at the very moment of temptation. Commit these to memory before the temptations arise.

1. FLEE and run from sin.

When that temptation arises, men of God must act quickly to run away from sin. Do not entertain the thought. For if you do, you'll soon justify it somehow and indulge. You must immediately put to death the inception of the thought and flee from it! Acknowledge your complete allegiance to God and put on loving thoughts and actions. Get out of or vary the situation immediately (2 Timothy 2:22).

2.**∟EAN** on God.

Call on God for strength to honor Him. Draw near to God and He will draw near to you (Psalm 37:5; James 4:8). Call upon God in your distresses and God will hear and God will save you from them. God is kind and eager to rescue His own from the moment of hardship. After all, Christ was there and He can relate. He suffered and was tempted in all ways. He can come to your aid and provide the way of escape. Lean on God. Call on God. Seek God.

3. **ENTERTAIN** right thoughts.

Rehearse those things for which you are grateful and thankful and remember to give thanks in all circumstances. Put off bad ways of thinking and replace it with diligent, intentional, deliberate, and regular thoughts of godliness and purity (Philippians 4:8-9). You must act upon what you *know* is right. You must get rid of impure thoughts and replace them with Godly thoughts. You must put on the Lord Jesus Christ (actively, intentionally, deliberately) and make *no provision* for the flesh with regard to its lusts. Entertain the right thoughts. Memorize Scripture and chew on it.

4. **EAGERLY** pursue love.

Continue to pursue love and righteousness. The opposite of lust is love. Lust is selfish and self-motivated and self-gratifying/self-fulfilling. True love is self-giving, others-motivated, and focused on fulfilling and serving them. Don't look back. Look to your 'ways to love and serve'. Engage yourself in giving (Proverbs 21:21). One of the ways to find the way of escape in the moment of temptation is to *actively serve others*. Yes, stop thinking of yourself and certainly do not isolate yourself or minimize your temptations. Seek ways to serve others and then *do it!* Pursue others in love!

FORTY DAYS JESUS WAS TEMPTED
