Psalm 120 The World wants War

Main Service

Background: These 15 Psalms (#120-134) were traveling songs that were sung by faithful Jews on their way to the Temple in Jerusalem.

There were 15 steps from the outer court of the Temple to the inner.

key phrase: "go up" Gen 35:1 Ezra 7:9 2 Chr 36:23 Psalm 122:4

Breakdown: Ps 120 - 124: The conflict of the Godly

Ps 125 - 129 : Their confidence in God

Ps 130 - 134: Their communion in God

word studies:

v 4 *juniper* - The strength of a juniper tree is seen in its capacity to survive in harsh and bare climates, growing and surviving in areas with very little water.

v 5 *coal*, n. - A piece of wood, or other combustible substance, ignited, burning, or charred. When burning or ignited, it is called a live coal or burning coal or coal of fire. When the fire is extinct, it is called charcoal.

v 6 Meshech Gen 10:2 Eze 38:3 ~ Gentiles, heathen, Antichrist

Kedar ('powerful') Gen 25:13 Eze 27:21 ~ Arabs, Turks, Muslims

Interpretation:

Hist: The Psalmist portrays the sharp arrows of anti-Semitism a Jew faces.

Spir: The life of the believer is is like this - it is an ascent.

After salvation we are pilgrims with our *traveling songs* as we grow in grace & truth. We are climbing in a spiritual way . . . we *go up* daily, and one day we'll *go up* literally !!!

Doct: This Psalm describes the conflict of a believer in the final half of Daniel's Seventieth week. Verses 2,3, 4, 5,6, and 7 refer to the Son of Perdition.
