**SERMON** – Quenching His Thirst

**1 Chronicles 11:1-5 (ESV)**

<sup>1</sup> Then all Israel gathered together to David at Hebron and said, “Behold, we are your bone and flesh. <sup>2</sup> In times past, even when Saul was king, it was you who led out and brought in Israel. And the Lord your God said to you, ‘You shall be shepherd of my people Israel, and you shall be prince over my people Israel.’” <sup>3</sup> So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron, and David made a covenant with them at Hebron before the Lord. And they anointed David king over Israel, according to the word of the Lord by Samuel. <sup>4</sup> And David and all Israel went to Jerusalem, that is, Jebus, where the Jebusites were, the inhabitants of the land. <sup>5</sup> The inhabitants of Jebus said to David, “You will not come in here.” Nevertheless, David took the stronghold of Zion, that is, the city of David.

**1 Chronicles 11:16-19 (ESV)**

<sup>16</sup> David was then in the stronghold, and the garrison of the Philistines was then at Bethlehem. <sup>17</sup> And David said longingly, “Oh that someone would give me water to drink from the well of Bethlehem that is by the gate!” <sup>18</sup> Then the three mighty men broke through the camp of the Philistines and drew water out of the well of Bethlehem that was by the gate and took it and brought it to David. But David would not drink it. He poured it out to the Lord <sup>19</sup> and said, “Far be it from me before my God that I should do this. Shall I drink the lifeblood of these men? For at the risk of their lives they brought it.” Therefore he would not drink it. These things did the three mighty men.

**Matthew 28:16-20 (ESV)**

<sup>16</sup> Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. <sup>17</sup> And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. <sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”
