- The coming harvest anticipated, Joel 3.13-19

 - o Parable of the Sower, Matthew 13.1-9

 - Parable of the weeds explained, Mathew 13.36-43

The Lord of the Harvest, 14.14-16

- Global Language
- An announcement, not a warning: Time's up
- A Son of Man on a white cloud, cf. Matthew 13.36-43; Daniel 7.13-14
 - o Sharp sickle
 - Crown: victor's crown
 - Quite a contrast to Bethlehem
- Another angel calling to the Son of Man with a loud voice
 - Harvest time for the grain
 - Sent by God the Father
 - o Probably bears out Jesus saying he did not know the time
- The harvest is reaped

The Grim Reaper, 14.17-20

Another angel with a sickle

- Another angel with authority over the altar /fire: we've met him before (cf. 6.9-11; 8.3-5)
- A divine assignment
- Remember, the martyrs are beneath the altar
 - o The altar fire consumed animals completely
- Harvest of the grapes
 - The harvesting of the people of God involves the judgment of none believers
 - o The language is borrowed from Isaiah 63
 - o Five foot waves of Blood flowing for 184 miles; cf. Joel 3.19

- 200 miles covers Israel; or the square of four (representing the world: north, south, east, west, time the square of ten, indicating completeness: complete judgment/blood over the whole earth
- o More than one commentator/pastor: the goriest verses in the bible
